JOINT STATUS REPORT

I. INTRODUCTION

In response to the Court's order of December 16, 2015, the parties submit this final joint notice to report on the status of the implementation of the settlement terms, as set forth in the Amended Agreed Order for Resolution ("Amended Agreement") entered by the Court on May 7, 2014.

The Amended Agreement resolved the claims of the United States that the defendant, First United Security Bank, now known as First US Bank¹ ("FUSB" or "the Bank"), violated the Fair Housing Act ("FHA"), 42 U.S.C. §§ 3601-3619, and the Equal Credit Opportunity Act ("ECOA"), 15 U.S.C. §§ 1691-1691f, by engaging in a pattern or practice of racial discrimination in the setting of interest rates for first-lien refinance loans originated in 2004 for owner-occupied one-to-four family houses and by failing to serve the lending needs of majority African-American census tracts in west central Alabama on an equal basis with majority-white tracts.

The parties can now report all provisions of the Amended Agreement have been met or

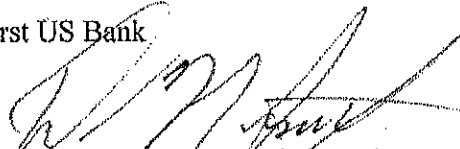

completed, including the depletion of the special financing program for residential and CRA small business and community development loans.

Considering the Bank's obligations in the Amended Agreement are fully met, the parties move this Court for an early termination of the term of the Amended Agreement.

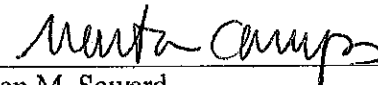

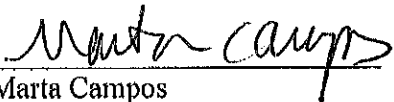
