PLAINTIFFS' STATUS REPORT

Pursuant to the Court's order of December 12, 2018, ECF No. 467, the plaintiffs submit the following status report concerning outstanding issues relating to the Rule 23(b)(2) class.

I. Material in possession of defendants Sheriff and Cook County relating to barriers faced by class members

1. Defendants are in possession of reports by Michael Gumm identifying "broad issues" in the following courthouses: Bridgeview, Rolling Meadows, Skokie, Markham, and Domestic Violence. These reports were referenced by Daniel Tardy, a Sheriff's employee, in an email dated April 3, 2018. See Exhibit 1, D. Tardy emails dated 4/3/2018. A copy of one report by Mr. Gumm dated March 2017 is attached as Exhibit 2.

2. Defendant Sheriff is in possession of emails from ADA Compliance Officer Sabrina Rivero-Canchola that "[t]rans needs more wheelchair vans to accommodate the court and medical movement of wheelchair detain-

ees.” Exhibit 1, D.Tardy email dated 4/3/2018; Exhibit 6, Del Russo Dec ¶ 3; Exhibit 8, Isom Dec ¶ 4.

3. Defendant Sheriff is in possession of daily emails titled “ADA Movement” identifying the duration wheelchair users attend court at Leighton. As reflected in an email for July 2, 2018 some wheelchair users spend hours at the Leighton Courthouse, an area without any ADA compliant toilets on the secured side of the building. See Exhibit 3, V.Payton email dated 7/2/2018.

4. Defendants Sheriff and County must have information regarding compliance with Court’s supplemental permanent injunction over renovations for two Maywood courthouses affirmed by the Seventh Circuit on July 30, 2018. *Lacy v. Cook County*, 897 F.3d 847, 867-69 (7th Cir. 2018).

II. Evidence defendants continue to violate the rights of class members when attending court

1. **Movement up and down ramps.** Sheriff refuses to push wheelchair users up and down ramps. In response to a grievance by class member Cornelius Walker concerning no assistance moving up and down ramps, Lt. Greer responded on behalf of the Sheriff on October 25, 2018 that “[i]t is not the responsibility of security staff to push inmates in wheelchairs.” Exhibit 13, Cornelius Walker Grievance. In addition, five class members executed declarations explaining movement up and down ramps without

assistance. Exhibit 4, Brewer Dec ¶¶ 3-4; Exhibit 5, Burns Dec ¶ 5; Exhibit 7, Dunn Dec ¶ 3; Exhibit 8, Isom Dec ¶ 3; Exhibit 12, Turner Dec ¶ 5.

2. **The Leighton Courthouse.** Class members attending court at Leighton are held adjacent to the courtroom in non-ADA compliant bullpens or in the clerk's office. Exhibit 5, Burns Dec ¶ 5; Exhibit 10, Perkins Dec ¶ 3. Some class members attending court on the upper floors must pass through a gate that is too narrow to allow for the passage of a wheelchair. Exhibit 5, Burns Dec ¶ 5; Exhibit 10, Perkins Dec ¶ 4. Class members are not provided notice of the Sheriff's purported practice to allow class members to use public ADA compliant bathroom. Exhibit 5, Burns Dec ¶ 5; Exhibit 10, Perkins Dec ¶ 3.

3. **Other courthouses.** The Sheriff continues to hold inmates in bullpens without ADA compliant toilets before and after court appearances. Exhibit 5, Burns Dec ¶ 3; Exhibit 6, Del Russo Dec ¶¶ 4-5; Exhibit 7, Dunn Dec ¶ 4; Exhibit 8, Isom Dec ¶ 5; Exhibit 9, McCowen Dec ¶¶ 3-4; Exhibit 11, Rosales Dec ¶ 3; Exhibit 12, Turner Dec ¶ 4.

III. Discovery necessary to prepare for injunction hearing and/or resolution

1. ADA Status Reports from January 1, 2016 to the present prepared by Michael Gumm and/or his successor.

2. Emails and documents maintained by the Sheriff and ADA Compliance Officer Rivero-Canchola about a need for more wheelchair accessi-

ble vans to move class members to court from January 1, 2016 to the present.

3. From November 1, 2018 to the present, the daily email of “ADA Movement” identifying class members move to and from the Leighton Courthouse.

4. Inspection of the path of travel for class members when attending court. This includes measurement and photographs of any ramps.

5. Evidence class members are transported to public ADA compliant bathrooms and evidence that class members are provided notice of this accommodation. Pursuant to a Sheriff memorandum, the use of a public ADA bathroom must be documented in a logbook maintained by a supervisor.

6. Depositions of Sheriff and County employees with knowledge of ADA barriers when class members attend court.

Hello Sabrina,
Thank you for getting back to us. We were reaching out to you because there are issues identified in emails and memos from you as well as in Gumm's report that may require corrective action but are not, to the best of our knowledge, included in the approved Capital Projects for 2018 and potentially require a Business Case for FY 2019.

Using your emails and memos, the notes from the walk throughs, and Gumm's report, John and I compiled a list of every ADA issue those documents identified. We then used the FY2018 CIP list and tried to place all of the issues your emails and memos, the notes from the walk throughs, and Gumm's report identified under the corresponding project (see attached). The majority of the issues identified in your emails/memos, Gumm's report, and the walk throughs are going to be covered by projects included on the FY2018 CIP list. However, there are items remaining that do not appear to pertain to any project and may require their own business case. For example, in a 7/6/17 you wrote that:

"🕒•Trans needs more wheelchair vans to accommodate the court and medical movement of wheelchair detainees.

🕒▪ Deaf and hard of hearing detainees do not have equal access to phones. Calls have to be scheduled with the social workers who are not on site during the weekend. We are installing video phones which should be completed by the end of the summer. (This is more policy than structure)"

Gumm's report identified broad issues in DIV4, DIV5, DIV6, DIV9, DIV10, and DIV11 as well as at the JTDC, Domestic Violence, Bridgeview, Markham, Maywood, Rolling Meadows, and Skokie.

Are these issues that a business case should be composed for? If so, who is responsible to draft it? Please let me know if there is any more information I can try and provide.

ADA Status Report March 2017

Cook County owns and operates a large number of buildings throughout the county. These buildings are managed through Cook County's Bureau of Asset Management. The Bureau is comprised of three departments; Asset Management, Facilities Management, and Capital Planning & Policy. DCP, in 2016, changed the way it manages capital improvements for Cook County. DCP developed a portfolio system comprised of Public Safety, Health & Hospitals, and Corporate Facilities. This report will address the Public Safety Portfolio only.

The way DCP addressed ADA improvements in the past was through a project by project approach. In 1998 DCP procured an A&E consultant to provide an assessment of ADA issues with County owned buildings. The result of the assessment led to improvements of courthouse "public" spaces, which included entries, corridors, restrooms, and courtrooms. The assessment specifically omitted secure areas of the facilities, including spaces secured for detainee holding and movement.

In 2014 DCP created a new position directed directly toward ADA compliance. DCP developed a job description, advertised for the position, interviewed and hired an ADA Compliance Project Director. The main duties of the DP is to address ADA compliance issued in all portfolios. However, an unanticipated consequence was the ADA CPD became involved with several federal ADA court cases, representing the County as an ADA expert.

The result of this involvement was the development of ADA projects based upon the alleged complaints in the civil suits. The Public Safety Portfolio has become the major focus of the ADA CPD since joining the County.

The RTU was newly constructed and opened for occupancy in August 2014. However, the design met the minimum ADA requirements for the tier dorms and segregation cells. When occupied additional ADA compliant beds and desk were needed. In addition there were other deficiencies noted, including placement of swing seats, shower head angle to wet the built in ADA seat, and ADA compliant table seating. The 2017 CIP includes funds to address these deficiencies and expand the capacity of ADA beds and desks. The toileting features for all tiers are ADA compliant and meet code requirements for the occupancy of each tier.

Part of 1998 County wide ADA upgrades project, courtrooms and public restrooms were altered to meet ADA Standards. Two male and one female lower level holding cells were altered to meet ADA Standards, including conforming toilet, sink, grab bars, bubbler, and bench.. The court room holding cells on the 1st and 2nd floors are technically infeasible to meet all of the ADA Standards. However, grab bars can be installed to assist individuals with disabilities using the toilet. The courtroom conference rooms on the 1st and 2nd floor need to be updated to meet current ADA Standards.

District 2 Rolling Meadows Courthouse

Part of 1998 Countywide ADA upgrades project, courtrooms and public restrooms were altered to meet ADA Standards. In 2014 two male and one female lower level holding cells were altered to meet current ADA Standards, including conforming toilet/sink combination units with front deck mounted bubbler, grab bars, and benches. In 2015 an ADA conforming ramp was constructed in the sally port providing an accessible route from the detainees transport to the lower level holding cells. Additional work needed includes updates to courtroom holding cells on the 1st and 2nd levels, as well as improvements to the adjacent conference rooms.

District 3 Maywood Courthouse

Part of 1998 County wide ADA upgrades project, courtrooms and public restrooms were altered to meet ADA Standards. In 2014 one male and one female lower level holding cell was updated by replacing the toilet/sink combination unit with an ADA compliant toilet/sink combination unit. The benches in the two cells were also replaced with ADA compliant benches. In 2015 an ADA conforming ramp in the sally port was constructed providing an accessible route from the detainees transport to the lower level holding cells. Additional work need includes updates to the 1st and 2nd floor courtroom holding cells.

District 4 Bridgeview Courthouse

Part of 1998 County wide ADA upgrades project, courtrooms and public restrooms were altered to meet ADA Standards. In 2014 two male and one female lower level holding cell was updated by installing an ADA compliant toilet/sink combination unit with an ADA compliant toilet/sink combination unit with a front deck mounted bubbler, grab bars, and benches. In 2015 an ADA conforming ramp was constructed in the sally port providing an accessible route from the detainees transport to the lower level holding cells. Additional work need includes updates to the 1st and 2nd floor courtroom holding cells and conference rooms.

District 5 Markham Courthouse

Part of 1998 County wide ADA upgrades project, courtrooms and public restrooms were altered to meet ADA Standards. In 2014 two male and one female lower level holding cell was updated by installing an ADA compliant toilet/sink combination unit with an ADA compliant toilet/sink combination unit with a front deck mounted bubbler, grab bars, and benches. In 2015 an ADA conforming ramp was constructed in the sally port providing an accessible route from the detainees transport to the lower level holding cells. Additional work need includes updates to the 1st and 2nd floor courtroom holding cells and conference rooms

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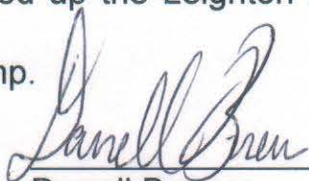

Under penalties of perjury as provided by law, the undersigned certifies that the following statements are true:

1. My name is Jeffrey Burns. I am a detainee at the Cook County Jail assigned booking number 2018-0424105.

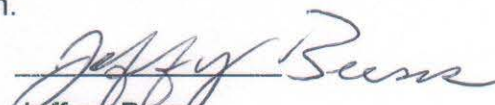
2. I have used a wheelchair during my detention for my court appearances at 111th Street in Chicago and the Leighton Courthouse.

3. When I attended court at 111th Street, I had to get out of my wheelchair to pass between a gate on the secured side of the building. The holding area did not have an accessible bathroom and I did not observe any notice that I may use a public accessible bathroom upon request.

4. When I attend court at Leighton, I generally have to push myself up and down ramps from my housing unit in the Cermak Infirmary.

5. I attend court on the 6th floor and must get out of my wheelchair to pass through a gate on the secured side of the floor. After I pass through this gate I am generally held in the clerk's office before court. Although I do not have a watch, it feels as if I am held in this office for hours on days when I attend court. I have never been offered access to a public accessible bathroom.

Under penalties of perjury as provided by law, the undersigned certifies that the following statements are true:

1. My name is Lawrence Del Russo. I am a detainee at the Cook County Jail assigned booking number 2013-0508249.

2. For a little over one year I have used a wheelchair to attend court at Markham.

3. About six months ago I was not transported to the courthouse for a scheduled appearance.

4. Each time I attend Markham I am held in the lower level. About half of the time when I use a wheelchair I am not assigned to an accessible cell in the lower level.

5. I am also routinely held in a holding cell adjacent to courtroom 103 in a small cell. It is difficult to enter and exit this cell and there are no grab bars near the cell toilet. I believe I am held in this cell for an hour or more. It is also very difficult and uncomfortable to move from this holding cell to my courtroom due to various barriers.

DECLARATION OF JASON ISOM

Under penalties of perjury as provided by law, the undersigned certifies that the following statements are true:

1. My name is Jason Isom. I am a detainee at the Cook County Jail assigned booking number 2017-0922002.

2. I have used a wheelchair during my detention for my court appearances at Markham because of a significant injury to my left leg.

3. In order to travel to and from the Markham courthouse I must travel up and down a steep ramp near the lower level of my housing unit, the Residential Treatment Unit (RTU). Almost every time I believe that I must roll myself up and down this ramp. I have requested assistance and I recall the Sheriff's employees tell me that it is not their responsibility to assist me.

4. I also believe that I missed court two times because a wheelchair accessible van was not available to transport me to the Markham Courthouse.

When I was not transported to court, I remember Sheriff's employees tell me that there were not enough wheelchair accessible vans to bring me to court.

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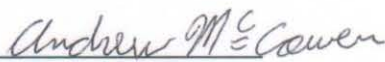

Under penalties of perjury as provided by law, the undersigned certifies that the following statements are true:

1. My name is Andrew McCowen. I am a detainee at the Cook County Jail assigned booking number 2018-0826132.
2. I have used a wheelchair during my detention for my court appearances at the Domestic Violence Courthouse at 555 W. Harrison.
3. When I attended court I was held in the lower level. I do not believe the holding cell had any grab bars near the toilet. I remember using the toilet during most court appearances and having to rock my body to get off the toilet because there was no grab bar to assist with transferring.

1. My name is Michael Perkins. I am a detainee at the Cook County Jail assigned booking number 2018-1016178.

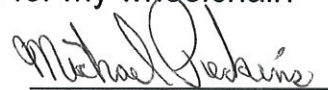
2. I use a wheelchair to attend court at the Leighton Courthouse because of a significant injury to my left leg.

3. I normally attend court in room ³⁰³~~305~~. Prior to appearing in court I am routinely held in the bullpen adjacent to this courtroom. Although I do not have a watch or access to a clock, it feels as if I am held in this bullpen for upwards of an hour. Although I have required to use the toilet when assigned to this bullpen, I have never been notified that I may use a public accessible toilet.

4. I also attended court on the fifth floor of Leighton. In order to enter the holding area on the fifth floor I was required to get out of my wheelchair because

a gate blocked the passage way for my wheelchair. And to enter and exit the bullpen adjacent to the fifth floor courtroom I also had to get out of my wheelchair because the passage way was too narrow for my wheelchair.

Under penalties of perjury as provided by law, the undersigned certifies that the following statements are true:

1. My name is Leshawn Turner. I am a detainee at the Cook County Jail assigned booking number 2018-0830226.

2. I have used a wheelchair during my detention because I have an external fixation on my right leg.

3. Since being processed into the Jail on August 30, 2018, I have attended court at the Leighton Courthouse and a Branch Courthouse at Harrison and Kedzie.

4. During court appearances at Harrison and Kedzie, there were occasions when I had to use the toilet. When this occurred, the Sheriff's employee would open up a holding cell and require me to use a toilet without grab bars around the toilet.

5. I periodically attend court at Leighton. During each appearance, I travel from my housing unit, the Cermak Infirmary, to the courthouse. There is a ramp located in close proximity to Cermak that I must travel up and down during each court appearance. I do not have regular assistance by Sheriff's employees moving up and down this ramp.
