Confirming our previous discussions, our office has been authorized to notify you that upon submission by the Chicago Housing Authority of its application for reservation for 3,500 units of low-income family housing, the Department of Housing and Urban Development will review said application. Within 30 days from the date of said submission, the Department of Housing and Urban Development through our office will notify you of the following:

- a. Whether said application for reservation has been approved.
- b. Whether said application for reservation has been denied and the reasons for said denial.
- c. Whether said application for reservation has not been denied nor approved in whole or in part, and the reasons pertaining thereto. Included in such reasons will be an estimation when the Department of Housing and Urban Development can take final action on the aforementioned reservation.
