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This matter coming to be heard on the motion of plaintiffs and defendant Chicago Housing Authority with the support of the Receiver for an order waiving the restriction on housing families with children in public housing units above the third story of any structure for specific developments in the Near North Revitalizing Area and the surrounding General Areas of the Near North Revitalization Initiative (NNRI); and

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The parties having represented that such housing will be in mixed-income developments, interspersed between affordable and market rate units, within a vibrant and revitalizing community possessing jobs, retail services, and educational, recreational, and cultural opportunities; and

The parties have represented that the Cabrini-Green Local Advisory Council supports this proposed order;

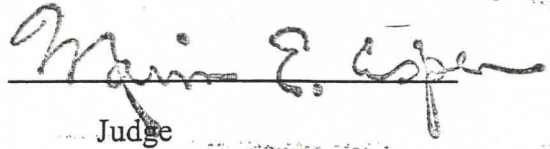
Now, therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. The Receiver shall be free to provide such number of public housing units designated below to families with children above the third floor of the following structures:
 - 1) Renaissance North Mid-Rise Building, 535 West North Avenue
 - 59 unit mixed-use building
 - 4 ½ stories
 - 18 public housing units dispersed throughout the development
 - 2) North Town Village Mid-Rise Building, 1311 N. Halsted Street
 - 88 unit, wholly residential building
 - 7 stories
 - 27 public housing units dispersed throughout the development
 - 3) Old Town Square Mid-Rise Building, 247 W. Scott Street
 - 30 unit, wholly residential building

- 4 stories
 - 10 public housing units dispersed throughout the development
- 4) Old Town Village East Mid-Rise Building, Exact Address Not Available (The development is located between Goethe St. on the North, the CTA tracks on the East, Division St. on the South, and Sedgwick St. on the West)
- 60 unit, wholly residential building
 - 7 stories
 - 16 public housing units dispersed throughout the development
- 5) Old Town Village East Walk-Up Buildings, Exact Address Not Available (The development is located between Goethe St. on the North, the CTA tracks on the East, Division St. on the South, and Sedgwick St. on the West)
- Twelve, 4 unit, wholly residential buildings
 - Each building is 4 stories
 - 1 public housing unit per building for a total of 12 public housing units
- 6) North Town Village Walk-Up Buildings, 1415 and 1427 N. Halsted
- Two, 8 unit, wholly residential buildings
 - Each building is 4 stories
 - Three public housing units per building for a total of 6 public housing units

2. This waiver applies only to buildings described herein. The general restriction on housing families in public housing units above the third story remains in effect unless otherwise ordered by this Court.
