**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

The tentative ruling is affirmed as follows: Plaintiffs' motion for a protective order regarding the deposition of Jerriyn Newland's daughters is DENIED. The depositions may proceed, but on the following conditions: (1) they must take place at a location no more than 10 miles from the residences of the deponents, (2) they must be limited to 2 hours each, and (3) they are to be limited in scope to matters affecting Jerriyn Newland and the stores where she worked and her comments and statements about those stores and about Wal-Mart generally.

The Court's order regarding the deposition of Jerriyn Newland's daughters is limited to the facts presented by this motion and should not be taken as an indication of similar issues regarding other named plaintiffs.
