ANSWERS TO INTERROGATORIES

1. No.
2. Answered.
3. In general detail, the duties of the Sheriff of Jefferson County, Alabama, are to maintain the peace within said County and to obey and enforce mandates of courts and to protect lives and property within Jefferson County.
4. Jefferson County jails located in Birmingham and Bessemer, Alabama.
5. Juvenile and Domestic Relations Court.
6. (a) through (f) A list of employees of Jefferson County Sheriff's Office with the job classification and title of each is attached to these answers. None of said employees are employees of the Negro race, all are employees of the Caucasian, or white, race.
7. Answered in (6) above.
8. Requests are made to the Jefferson County Personnel Board for certification of qualified applicants for particular job classification and selection and hiring is done from those certified by the Jefferson County Personnel Board.
9. Yes, I am aware of the provisions of law referred to in Interrogatory No. 9. Convicts in Jefferson County are separated within the two jails within my jurisdiction according not

only to their race and sex, but also according to their age and offense.

10. Though white and colored convicts are not confined within the same cell together, the same facilities are used interchangeably for all convicts regardless of race, color, age, sex or offense.

11. This office does not make reports directly to the Governor, but does report to the State Prison Inspector monthly. This report does indicate the number of white males, Negro males, white females, and Negro females. A copy of the report made for the month of May, 1966 is attached hereto.

12. Yes.

13. (a) No prisoners are chained together. (b) No. (c) Yes. (d) We have no provisions for athletic or other recreational events within the Jefferson County jails. (e) While the same identical cell and cell block facilities are used for white and Negro convicts, they are not confined within the same cell or cell block at the same time.

14. No.

15. Convicts are segregated according to sex, race, age and offense.

16. Yes. Copy attached hereto.

Federal prisoners are treated differently in that they are not required to work in the County jail while other prisoners are. They are confined in separate cell blocks from other prisoners and are attended by a different physician than the other prisoners.

17. \$2.50 per day per prisoner.

18. See Exhibit "B" attached to the contract referred to in (17) above.

19. My office complies with this provision of the Alabama law. Our facilities are all connected and are all identical except
