STIPULATION & CONSENT DECREE

Now into Court come the following parties:

John T. King, Secretary, Louisiana Department of Corrections; and

David C. Treen, Governor of the State of Louisiana, represented through his executive counsel, P. Raymond Lamonica.

[1] The parties to this Stipulation and Consent Decree acknowledge the jurisdiction of this Court and agree to be bound by its terms and conditions.

[2] As used in this Stipulation and Consent Decree and the attached Exhibits, the term "Department of Corrections" shall, upon merger of the Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Safety, refer to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections. (The Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Safety and Corrections are sometimes referred to hereafter as "DOC".) Any report, notice, application or other document required or authorized to be given to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections under this Stipulation and Consent Decree shall, upon merger of the Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Safety, be given to both the Secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections and to the Deputy Secretary for Corrections Services. Any report, notice, application or other document required or authorized to be filed or submitted by the Secretary of the Department of Corrections under this Stipulation and Consent Decree shall, upon merger of the Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Safety, be filed or submitted jointly by the Secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections and by the Deputy Secretary for Corrections Services.

[3] As used in this Stipulation and Consent Decree, "warden" shall refer to the current and any successor warden or acting warden of an institution.

[4] By order dated April 21, 1981, the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit found that litigation in the United States District Courts in the State of Louisiana involving the constitutional rights of inmates in Louisiana state and parish penal institutions should be dealt with "as a unified whole and not in a piecemeal fashion." The Court designated the United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana as the court to hear all pending or future actions dealing with that subject. Pursuant to the order of the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit, this Court has exercised jurisdiction over conditions in the state penitentiary, parish prisons, and other penal institutions of the State of Louisiana. The present Stipulation and Consent Decree is intended to assure that inmates in the penal institutions under the supervision and control of the State of Louisiana are afforded the

protections to which they are entitled under the Eighth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

[5] The Secretary of the DOC represents that the terms of this Stipulation and Consent Decree may in some respects exceed the minimal requirements imposed by the Eighth Amendment of the United States Constitution. This Stipulation and Consent Decree is not an admission of liability and particularly is not an admission of bad faith on the part of the DOC or any other party. This Stipulation and Consent Decree shall not constitute evidence of an adjudication and shall not be used or admitted into evidence in any other litigation or proceeding. Nothing in this Stipulation and Consent Decree shall be construed to create an obligation to an individual prisoner or employee of the DOC, and failure to comply with this Stipulation and Consent Decree shall not be deemed to be per se a breach of a civil duty owed to any individual prisoner or employee. Rather, this Stipulation and Consent Decree is entered into in a good faith effort to terminate litigation and resolve constitutional questions which have been raised concerning institutions under the supervision and control of the State of Louisiana. This Stipulation and Consent Decree may be modified as provided hereafter. Additionally, the Court retains jurisdiction to modify the terms and conditions of this Stipulation and Consent Decree upon motion of the parties or upon its own motion.

[6] By this ~~Stipulation~~ and Consent Decree, the DOC agrees to maintain conditions, limitations and standards at eight penal institutions under its supervision and control as set forth in the following eight exhibits to this document:

Exhibit A. Dixon Correctional Institute, located in East Feliciana Parish, Louisiana (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Dixon"). For purposes of this Stipulation and Consent Decree, the former Jackson Special Hospital and the former Jackson Special Hospital Laboratory shall be included as part of Dixon as Units III and V, respectively. The DOC agrees to maintain the conditions, limitations and standards at Dixon as set forth in Exhibit A to this Stipulation and Consent Decree during the term of this Stipulation and Consent Decree. The provisions of Exhibit A are incorporated by reference into this Stipulation and Consent Decree.

Exhibit B. Hunt Correctional Center located in Iberville Parish, Louisiana (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Hunt"). The DOC agrees to maintain the conditions, limitations and standards at Hunt as set forth in Exhibit B to this Stipulation and Consent Decree during the term of this Stipulation and Consent Decree. The provisions of Exhibit B are incorporated into this Stipulation and Consent Decree by reference.

Exhibit C. Louisiana Correctional and Industrial School located in Beauregard Parish, Louisiana (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "DeQuincy"). The DOC agrees to maintain the conditions, limitations and standards at DeQuincy as set forth in Exhibit C to this Stipulation and Consent Decree during the term of this

Stipulation and Consent Decree. The provisions of Exhibit C are incorporated into this Stipulation and Consent Decree by reference.

- Exhibit D. Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women located in Iberville Parish, Louisiana (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "St. Gabriel"). The DOC agrees to maintain the conditions, limitations and standards at St. Gabriel as set forth in Exhibit D to this Stipulation and Consent Decree during the term of this Stipulation and Consent Decree. The provisions of Exhibit D are incorporated into this Stipulation and Consent Decree by reference.
- Exhibit E. Louisiana State Penitentiary located in West Feliciana Parish, Louisiana (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Angola"). The DOC agrees to maintain the conditions, limitations and standards at Angola as set forth in Exhibit E to this Stipulation and Consent Decree during the term of this Stipulation and Consent Decree. The provisions of Exhibit E are incorporated into this Stipulation and Consent Decree by reference.
- Exhibit F. Wade Correctional Center located in Claiborne Parish, Louisiana (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Wade"). The DOC agrees to maintain the conditions, limitations and standards at Wade as set forth in Exhibit F to this Stipulation and Consent Decree during the term of this Stipulation and Consent Decree. The provisions of Exhibit F are incorporated into this Stipulation and Consent Decree by reference.
- Exhibit G. Washington Correctional Institute located in Washington Parish, Louisiana (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Washington"). The DOC agrees to maintain the conditions, limitations and standards at Washington as set forth in Exhibit G to this Stipulation and Consent Decree during the term of this Stipulation and Consent Decree. The provisions of Exhibit G are incorporated into this Stipulation and Consent Decree by reference.
- Exhibit H. Work Training Facility-North located in Rapides Parish, Louisiana (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Camp Beauregard"). For purposes of this Stipulation and Consent Decree, the Woodworth Forestry Center shall be included as part of Camp Beauregard as North Dorm and South Dorm. The DOC agrees to maintain the conditions, limitations and standards at Camp Beauregard as set forth in Exhibit H to this Stipulation and Consent Decree during the term of this Stipulation and Consent Decree. The provisions of Exhibit H are incorporated into this Stipulation and Consent Decree by reference.

The State Police Barracks located in East Baton Rouge Parish and the Work Training Facility-South (Jackson Barracks) located in Orleans Parish are governed by previous individual Consent Decrees approved by this Court on May 10, 1983.

[7] In addition to the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Exhibits A through H, the DOC agrees to comply with all applicable health and fire rules and regulations adopted pursuant to Louisiana law which affect the health and safety of inmates. A copy of Stipulation and Consent Decree (including Exhibits A through K) shall be delivered to the State Health Officer and the State Fire Marshall.

[8] This Stipulation and Consent Decree shall be in effect as of November 1, 1983, and shall remain in full force and effect for a period of three years from November 1, 1983. If the Court finds an imminent threat of violations of the Eighth Amendment, then this Court shall have the right to extend the duration of this Stipulation and Consent Decree for up to an additional three years. The Court may terminate this Stipulation and Consent Decree prior to November 1, 1986 if the Court finds that there exists no imminent threat of violations of the Eighth Amendment.

[9] During the term of this Stipulation and Consent Decree, the DOC or any warden of any institution governed by this Stipulation and Consent Decree shall not authorize or participate in any act or failure to act which would depart from, or would require a departure from, the conditions, limitations and standards set forth herein (including the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in the attached exhibits), unless the DOC shall have first obtained an order of this Court authorizing such departure. Such order shall be sought by application in the form set forth in exhibit I, attached hereto, and must be signed by the warden of the institution affected and by the Secretary of the DOC.

[10] Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding paragraph, the Secretary of the DOC or any warden may depart from, or authorize departure from, the conditions, limitations and standards set forth herein upon the occurrence of (a) an event which constitutes an immediate or direct threat to the life, health or safety of one or more individuals, or (b) an event which renders compliance impossible and which does not become manifest until such time that it is impossible for the warden or the Secretary of the DOC to either achieve compliance or seek Court authorization for a modification under the previous paragraph. Whenever the DOC or any warden relies upon the provisions of this paragraph, a full written report disclosing the institution(s) involved, the date(s) and duration of the departure, the number of inmates affected, and fully describing the reason and extent of the departure, shall be submitted to this Court within three days, exclusive of weekends and holidays, from the date on which such departure commenced. In no event shall such a departure continue without written court authorization for more than ten days after the submission of the written report.

[11] On or before November 30 of each year during the term of this Stipulation and Consent Decree, commencing November 30, 1984, the DOC shall submit a separate annual report for each institution covered by this Stipulation and Consent Decree. Each annual report shall be signed by the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of the institution for which the report is submitted. The annual report shall cover the annual period beginning on November 1 of the previous year and ending on October 31 of the year in which the report is submitted. The report shall be in the form set forth in exhibit J, and the report shall include the following information:

- (a) inmate population on the first day of each month covered by the report;
- (b) number of security officers actually employed and assigned full time to security functions on the first day of each month covered by the report;
- (c) the number by category of the following listed violent incidents which occurred at the institution during each month covered by the report:
 - (1) gunshots against inmates based on inmate action;
 - (2) sex offenses (two parties, consenting and non-consenting);
 - (3) assaults - with or without weapons - which result in bodily injury;
 - (4) deaths;
 - (5) escapes and attempted escapes which are turned over to the district attorney;
 - (6) riots; and
 - (7) other: i.e. hunger strikes, work stoppage, disorders by multiple inmates, fires, etc.

A copy of each annual report shall also be submitted to the Judicial Administrator for the Supreme Court of Louisiana with a request that a copy of each annual report be disseminated to judges having felony jurisdiction.

[12] Exhibits A through H to this Stipulation and Consent Decree shall be acknowledged by the wardens of the respective institutions. The wardens shall disseminate copies of this Stipulation and Consent Decree to appropriate supervisory personnel at the institutions. No new warden shall assume his duties as warden of any of the eight institutions covered by this Stipulation and Consent Decree until he has executed an acknowledgment in the form and substance set forth in the attached exhibit K. If the warden of any institution covered by this Stipulation and Consent Decree becomes aware of any conditions within his institution which violate this Stipulation and Consent Decree or any amendment thereto, or any conditions which would constitute cruel and unusual punishment, he shall report such conditions to the Secretary of the DOC and to this Court immediately.

[13] If the Secretary of the DOC receives any information or report (including but not limited to a report submitted by a warden of any institution governed by the Stipulation and Consent Decree) which leads him to believe that the purposes of this Stipulation and Consent Decree can be more effectively or efficiently accomplished, then he shall submit an application for modification to the Court in substantially the form of Exhibit I.

John T. King, Louisiana State Department of Corrections consents to the issuance and entry of a final judgment and decree in the form and content set forth above and in the attached exhibits without further notice.

EXHIBIT A

DIXON CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTE

I. Maximum Inmate Population

1.1 Maximum Present Inmate Population

Population

The Department of Corrections ("DOC") agrees and stipulates that no more than 924 inmates are housed in existing housing areas at Dixon Correctional Institute (Dixon) as of November 1, 1983. For purposes of this Exhibit A, the former Jackson Special Hospital and Jackson Special Hospital Laboratory shall be included as part of Dixon as Unit III and Unit V, respectively. The DOC further agrees and stipulates that no more than 924 inmates shall be housed in the existing housing areas of Dixon at any time during the term, or any extensions, of the Stipulation and Consent Decree which became effective as of November 1, 1983, (the "Decree"). The DOC shall not be authorized to house inmates in the existing housing areas unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II, below, are maintained.

1.2 Maximum Increase in Inmate Population

The DOC agrees and stipulates that during the term or any extension of the Decree no more than 60 inmates shall be housed in the Honor Dormitory of Unit IV (expected completion date - February, 1985). The DOC shall not be authorized to house any inmates in the Honor Dormitory of Unit IV unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part III, below, are maintained.

II. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Present Inmate Population

2.1 DOC's right to house 924 inmates in existing housing areas at Dixon during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part II.

2.2 Distribution

The inmates housed at Dixon shall be distributed in dormitories as indicated below.

2.3 Cellblock A

Inmates shall be housed in Cellblock A only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment, or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any 30 day period.

The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in Cellblock A from the effective date of the Decree shall be 32. If deemed necessary by the warden, up to two inmates may be housed in each cell of Cellblock A on a temporary basis until May 31, 1984, provided that no inmate shall be housed in a cell with another inmate for more than 45 days in any 90 day period. Notwithstanding the above, if deemed necessary by the warden, an inmate diagnosed as suffering from hepatitis may be housed in a single cell with another inmate diagnosed as suffering from hepatitis for up to 90 days within any 125 day period. Not later than May 15, 1984, the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of Dixon shall submit to the Court a written report describing the experience of housing two inmates in individual cells at Dixon during the period from November 1, 1983 through April 30, 1984. The report shall state whether it remains necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, and, if so, the report shall propose reasonable time or other limitations on the practice of housing two inmates in individual cells. Upon receipt of a report stating

that it remains necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, the Court shall enter an order accepting the proposal of the Secretary of the DOC and the warden, or designating additional or more stringent limitations.

2.4 Security Assignments * *Stip*

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for the housing areas and cellblocks as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit A-1.
- b. The purposes of the Decree may be satisfied by deployment of security guards in the housing areas and cellblocks in the manner designated on the site plans for Dixon which have been submitted to this Court as part of a separate Exhibit L. However, the warden may redeploy security guards within any housing area, provided that:
 - (i) there is no reduction in the total number of security guards within any housing area, and
 - (ii) the redeployment will more effectively assure prison safety and efficiency.
- c. In addition to the security guards assigned to housing areas and cellblocks as indicated above, a minimum of 176 additional security guards shall be assigned to other areas of Dixon, such as assigned as "roving" security guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas or work crew supervisors. At any given time, no more than four of these additional security guards shall be assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

2.5 Health and Medical Personnel

- a. The following health and medical personnel shall be employed on a full time basis:

1 Registered Nurse III
3 Registered Nurses II
5 Practical Nurses II
1 Physician IV
1 Dentist II

- b. The following medical services shall be retained on a contract basis:

Radiologist (8 hours/week)
Pharmacist (20 hours/week)
Optometrist (4 hours/week)
Physician (20 hours/week)

- c. In the event that health or medical personnel or services are terminated as a result of retirement, resignation or otherwise, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall initiate the procedure for filling the vacated position or contracting for the lost services. The warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall obtain replacement health and medical contract services on a temporary basis until the services are again under contract. If a health or medical position (whether personnel or contract services) does not remain vacant for more than 30 days, then, notwithstanding any provision of the Decree or this Exhibit, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall have no obligation to report such vacancy or obtain court authority for such vacancy.

2.6 Special Conditions for Units III and V

a. Unit III

Unit III is currently being used to house hepatitis carriers. Upon the construction and availability of 60 medical isolation cells at Hunt Correctional Center (see Exhibit B to the Decree), Unit III shall be renovated and converted to a work-training facility.

b. Unit V

Unit V is currently also being used on a temporary basis to house hepatitis carriers. Unit V shall be converted for use as a work-release program.

III. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Increase in Inmate Population

- 3.1 The DOC's right to house 60 inmates in the Honor Dormitory of Unit IV during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part III.

3.2 Maintenance of Existing Conditions, Limitations and Standards

All conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II of this Exhibit are and shall continue to be maintained.

3.3 Distribution

All 60 additional inmates shall be housed in the Honor Dormitory of Unit IV.

3.4 New Construction

a. Unit IV

Unit IV, including the Honor Dormitory and Cellblock B, shall be constructed and available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit A-2(1).

b. Infirmary

The proposed infirmary shall be constructed and available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit A-2(2).

3.5 Use of Cellblock B

Inmates shall be housed in Cellblock B only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment, or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any 30 day period.

In the event that the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of Dixon determine that it is necessary to house two inmates in individual cells of Cellblock B, then a proposal incorporating reasonable time or other limitations on the practice of housing two inmates in individual cells shall be made part of the Certificate of Compliance filed in accordance with paragraph 3.8 of this Consent Decree. Upon receipt of a Certificate of Compliance stating that it is necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, the Court shall enter an order accepting the proposal of the Secretary of the DOC and the warden, or designating additional or more stringent requirements. The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in Cellblock B shall be 50 or 100, depending on whether double celling is permitted.

3.6 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for the Honor Dormitory and Cellblock B as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit A-1.
- b. In addition to the security guards assigned to the Honor Dormitory and Cellblock B, as designated above, a minimum of 31 additional security guards (in addition to the 176 security guards required under Subparagraph 2.4(c) of this Exhibit) shall be assigned to other areas of Dixon, assigned as "roving" security guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas. These additional security guards shall not include security guards assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

3.7 Health and Medical Personnel

- a. The following additional health and medical personnel (in addition to the health and medical personnel required under Subparagraph 2.5(a) of this Exhibit) shall be employed on a full time basis:

1 Registered Nurse II (a total of four Registered Nurse II)
1 Practical Nurse III (a total of six Practical Nurses III)

- b. The following additional health and medical personnel (in addition to the health and medical personnel required under Subparagraph 2.5(b) of this Exhibit) shall be retained on a contract basis:

Oral Surgeon (4 hours/week)

- 3.8 Not less than 15 days before the date any inmates are housed in the Honor Dormitory, the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of Dixon shall file with the Court a Certification of Compliance in substantially the form and substance of Exhibit A-3, certifying that the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Exhibit A have been met.

IV. Acknowledgment and Certification

I, Burl Cain, warden of Dixon Correctional Institute, acknowledge that I have carefully read the Stipulation and Consent Decree and this Exhibit A. I certify that the information set forth in Exhibit A is, to the best of my knowledge, true and correct and accurately reflects existing conditions at Dixon Correctional Institute. I further certify that if I become aware of a more effective method to accomplish the purposes of the Stipulation and Consent Decree, I will submit a written request for modification to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor. I further certify that if I become aware of any conditions at Dixon Correctional Institute which violate the Stipulation and Consent Decree or any amendment thereto, or any conditions which would constitute cruel and unusual punishment, then I will immediately report such conditions to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor and to the Honorable Frank Polozola, Judge, United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana.

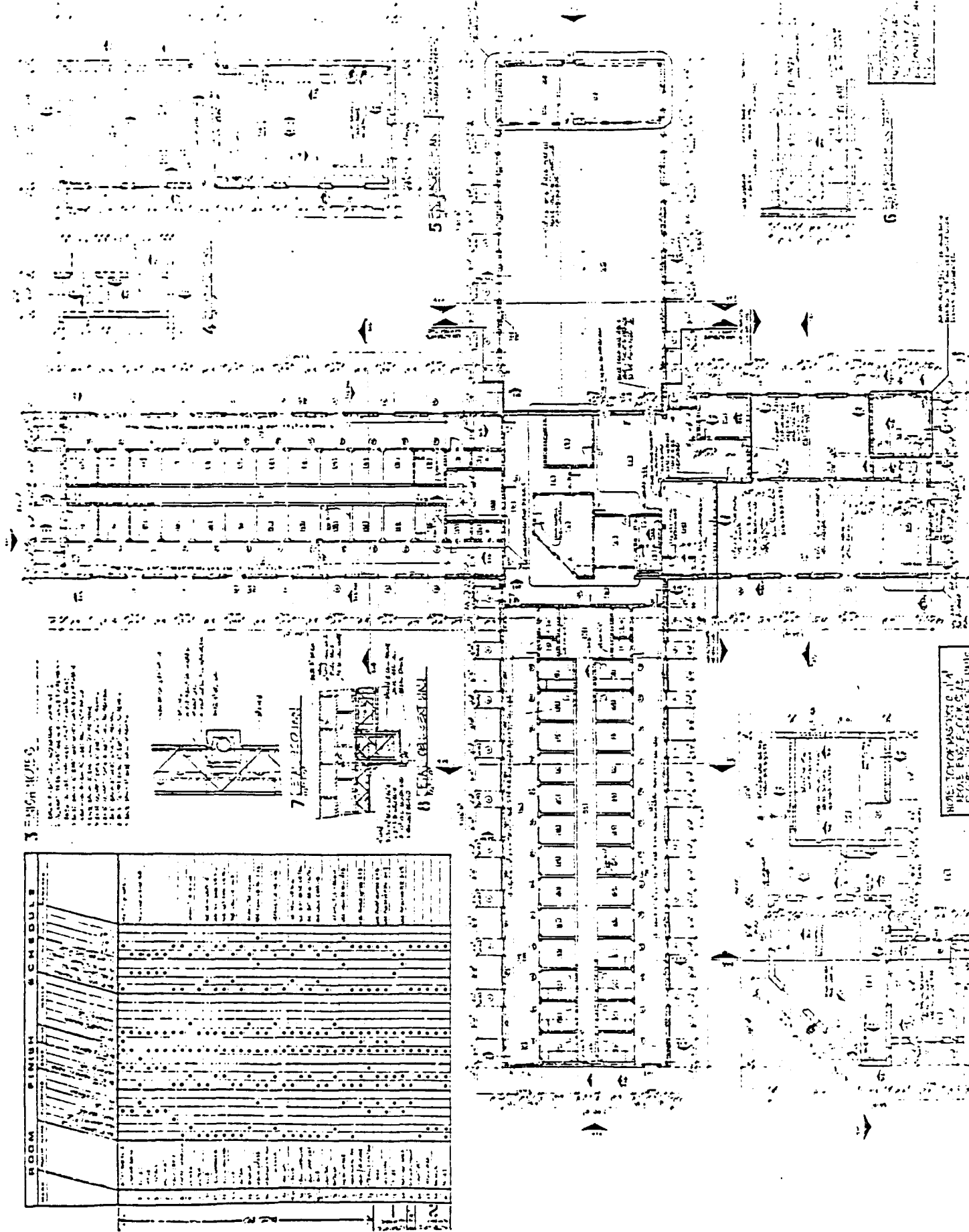

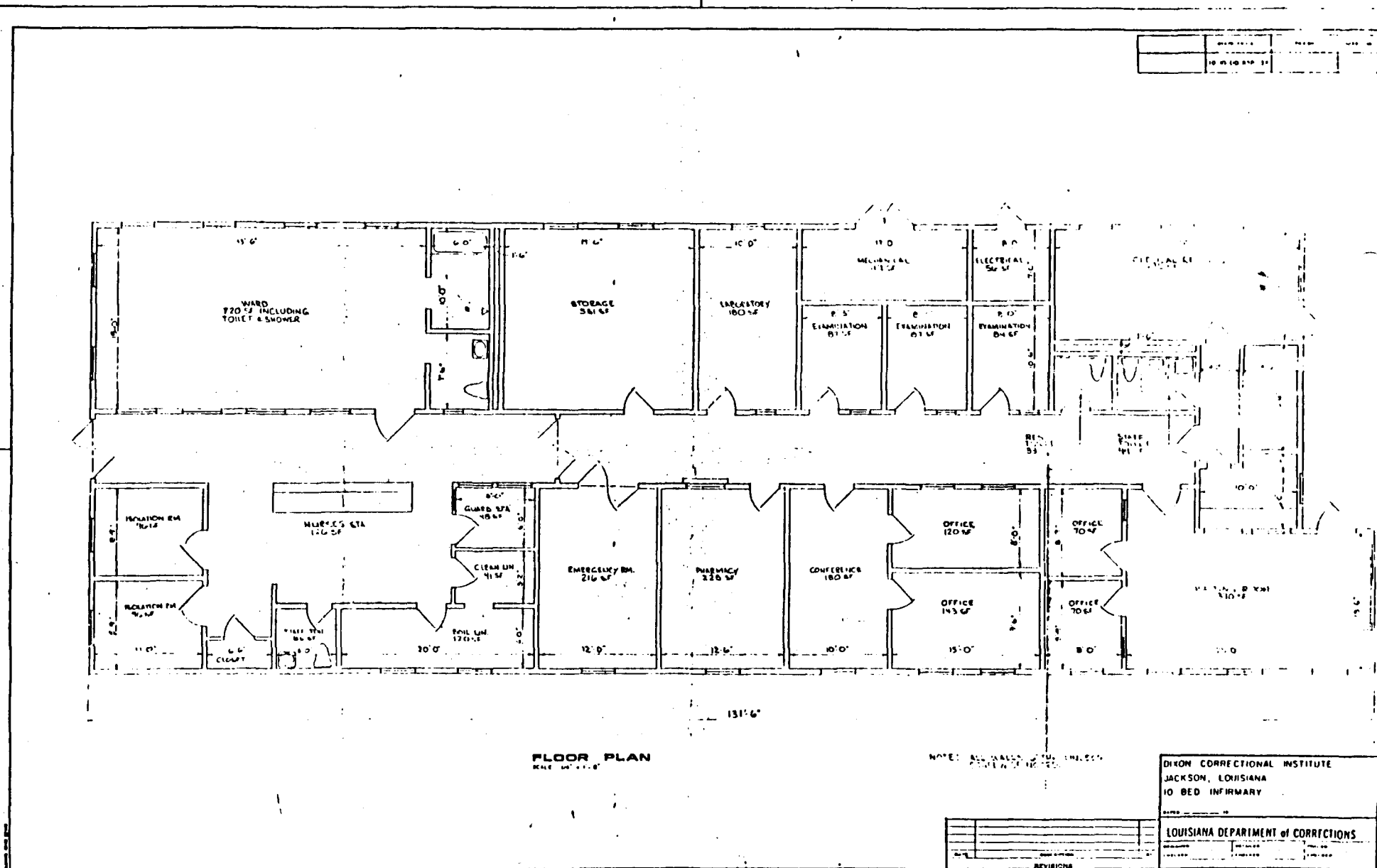

EXHIBIT B

HUNT CORRECTIONAL CENTER

I. Maximum Inmate Population

1.1 Maximum Present Inmate Population

The Department of Corrections ("DOC") agrees and stipulates that no more than 1195 inmates are housed in existing housing areas at Hunt Correctional Center (Hunt) as of November 1, 1983. The DOC further agrees and stipulates that no more than 1195 inmates shall be housed in the existing housing areas of Hunt at any time during the term, or any extensions, of the Stipulation and Consent Decree dated November 1, 1983 (the "Decree"). The DOC shall not be authorized to house inmates in the existing housing areas unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II, below, are maintained.

1.2 Maximum Increase in Populations

The DOC agrees and stipulates that during the term or any extension of the Decree no more than 289 inmates shall be housed in New Dorm I (expected completion date - July, 1984); no more than 289 inmates shall be housed in New Dorm II (expected completion date - July, 1984), and no more than 64 inmates shall be housed in the Medical Isolation Cells (expected completion date - January, 1984). The DOC shall not be authorized to house any inmates in New Dorm I, New Dorm II, or the Medical Isolation Cells unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part III, below, are maintained.

II. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Present Inmate Population

2.1 DOC's right to house 1195 inmates in existing housing areas at Hunt during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part II.

2.2 Distribution

The inmates housed at Hunt shall be distributed in dormitories as indicated below.

2.3 Cellblock I-Tiers A, B, C, D and Observation

Inmates shall be housed in Cellblock I-Tiers A, B, C, D and Observation only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment, or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any 30 day period.

The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in Cellblock I-Tiers A, B, C, D and Observation from the effective date of the Decree shall be 129, distributed as follows:

A-Tier	32

D-Tier	32

If deemed necessary by the warden, up to two inmates may be housed in each cell of Cellblock I-Tiers A, B, C and D on a temporary basis until May 31, 1983, provided that no inmate shall be housed in a cell with another inmate for more than 45 days in any 90 day period. Not later than May 15, 1984, the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of Hunt shall submit to the Court a written report describing the experience of housing two inmates in individual cells at Hunt during the period from November 1, 1983 through April 30, 1984. The report shall state whether it remains necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, and, if so, the report shall propose reasonable time or other limitations on the practice of housing two inmates in individual cells. Upon receipt of a report stating that it remains necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, the Court shall enter an order accepting the proposal of the Secretary of the DOC and the warden, or designating additional or more stringent limitations.

2.4 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for the housing areas and cellblocks as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit B-1.
- b. The purposes of the Decree may be satisfied by deployment of security guards in the housing areas and cellblocks in the manner designated on the site plans for Hunt which have been submitted to this Court as part of a separate Exhibit L. However, the warden may redeploy security guards within any housing area, provided that:
 - (i) there is no reduction in the total number of security guards within any housing area, and
 - (ii) the redeployment will more effectively assure prison safety and efficiency.
- c. In addition to the security guards assigned to housing areas and cellblocks as indicated above, a minimum of 302 additional security guards shall be assigned to other areas of Hunt, assigned as "roving" security guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas. At any given time, no more than eight of these additional security guards shall be assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

2.5 Health and Medical Personnel

- a. The following health and medical personnel shall be employed on a full time basis:

- 1 Dental Asst. II
- 1 Dental Hygienist (shared with Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women)
- 1 Physician IV
- 1 Physician III (shared with Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women)(provided that, if this physician is assigned to Hunt for less than 20 hrs/wk, then such services shall be replaced by contractual services to the extent necessary to provide Hunt a total of 20 hrs/wk.)
- 1 Physician II
- 1 Registered Nurse IV
- 1 Registered Nurse III
- 4 Registered Nurses II
- 4 Practical Nurses III
- 6 Medical Specialist II
- 1 Dentist II
- 1 Pharmacist II
- 1 Pharmacist (shared with Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women)

1 Lab Technician III
1 Radiologist Technician II

b. The following medical services shall be retained on a contract basis:

Physician (20 hours/week)
Radiologist (4 hours/week)
Optometrist (10 hours /week)
Psychiatrist (14 hours/week)

c. In the event that health or medical personnel or services are terminated as a result of retirement, resignation or otherwise, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall initiate the procedure for filling the vacated position or contracting for the lost services. The warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall obtain replacement health and medical contract services on a temporary basis until the services are again under contract. If a health or medical position (whether personnel or contract services) does not remain vacant for more than 30 days, then, notwithstanding any provision of the Decree or this Exhibit, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall have no obligation to report such vacancy or obtain court authority for such vacancy.

III. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Increase in Inmate Population

3.1 The DOC's right to house 289 inmates in New Dorm I, 289 inmates in New Dorm II and 64 inmates in the Medical Isolation Cells during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part III. Some of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part III apply only to restrict the housing of inmates in specified housing areas. Except where specifically limited in this manner, however, the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part must be maintained in order to house any inmates in New Dorm I, New Dorm II or the Medical Isolation Cells.

3.2 Maintenance of Existing Conditions, Limitations and Standards

All conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II of this Exhibit are and shall continue to be maintained.

3.3 Distribution

Additional inmates shall be housed in newly constructed housing areas of Hunt as indicated below:

3.4 New Construction

a. New Dorm I, New Dorm II and Medical Isolation Cells

Before any inmates shall be housed in New Dorm I that housing area shall be constructed and available for use in accordance with the schematic diagrams attached as Exhibit B-2(1). Before any inmates shall be housed in New Dorm II that housing area shall be constructed and available for use in accordance with the schematic diagrams attached as Exhibit B-2(2). Before any inmates shall be housed in the Medical Isolation Cells that housing area shall be constructed and available for use in accordance with the schematic diagrams attached as Exhibits B-2(3).

b. Cellblock II

Inmates may be housed in New Dorm I and the Medical Isolation Cells prior to the construction of Cellblock II. However, no inmates shall be housed in New Dorm II until Cellblock II is constructed and available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit B-2(4).

3.5 Use of Cellblock II

Inmates shall be housed in Cellblock II only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment, or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any 30 day period.

In the event that the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of Hunt determine that it is necessary to house two inmates in individual cells of Cellblock II, then a proposal incorporating reasonable time or other limitations on the practice of housing two inmates in individual cells shall be made part of the Certificate of Compliance filed in accordance with paragraph 3.8 of this Consent Decree. Upon receipt of a Certificate of Compliance stating that it is necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, the Court shall enter an order accepting the proposal of the Secretary of the DOC and the warden, or designating additional or more stringent requirements. The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in Cellblock II shall be 64 or 128, depending on whether double celling is permitted.

3.6 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for New Dorm I, New Dorm II, the Medical Isolation Cells and Cellblock II as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit B-1, provided, however, that security assignments need not be maintained for housing areas or cellblocks which are not being used.
- b. In addition to the security guards assigned to New Dorm I, New Dorm II, the Medical Isolation Cells and Cellblock II, as designated above, a minimum of 84 additional security guards (in addition to the 302 security guards required under Subparagraph 2.4(c) of this Exhibit) shall be assigned to other areas of Hunt, assigned as "roving" guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas. The DOC need not maintain assignment of all 68 additional guards in the event that only some of the new living areas are utilized, provided that enough additional security guards are assigned to assure prison safety. These additional security guards shall not include security guards assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

3.7 Health and Medical Personnel

- a. The following additional health and medical personnel (in addition to the health and medical personnel required under Subparagraph 2.5(a) of this Exhibit) shall be employed on a full time basis:
 - 2 Registered Nurse III (a total of three Registered Nurse III)
 - 5 Practical Nurse III (a total of nine Practical Nurses III)
 - 1 Laboratory Technician II

- b. The following additional health and medical personnel (in addition to the health and medical personnel required under Subparagraph 2.5(b) of this Exhibit) shall be retained on a contract basis:

Radiologist (4 hours/week for a total of 8 hours/week)
Orthopedist (8 hours/week)

- 3.8 Not less than 15 days before the date any inmates are housed in New Dorm I, New Dorm II, or the Medical Isolation Cells, the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of Hunt shall file with the Court, a Certification of Compliance, in substantially the form and substance of Exhibit B-3, certifying that the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Exhibit B have been met. A separate Certification of Compliance may be submitted for New Dorm I, New Dorm II, and the Medical Isolation Cells, certifying that all conditions, limitations and standards pertinent to the individual housing area have been met.

IV. Acknowledgment and Certification

I, John Whitley, Warden of Hunt Correctional Center, acknowledge that I have carefully read the Stipulation and Consent Decree and this Exhibit B. I certify that the information set forth in Exhibit B is, to the best of my knowledge, true and correct and accurately reflects existing conditions at Hunt Correctional Center. I further certify that if I become aware of a more effective method to accomplish the purposes of the Stipulation and Consent Decree, I will submit a written request for modification to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor. I further certify that if I become aware of any conditions at Hunt Correctional Center which violate the Stipulation and Consent Decree or any amendment thereto, or any conditions which would constitute cruel and unusual punishment, then I will immediately report such conditions to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor and to the Honorable Frank Polozola, Judge, United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana.

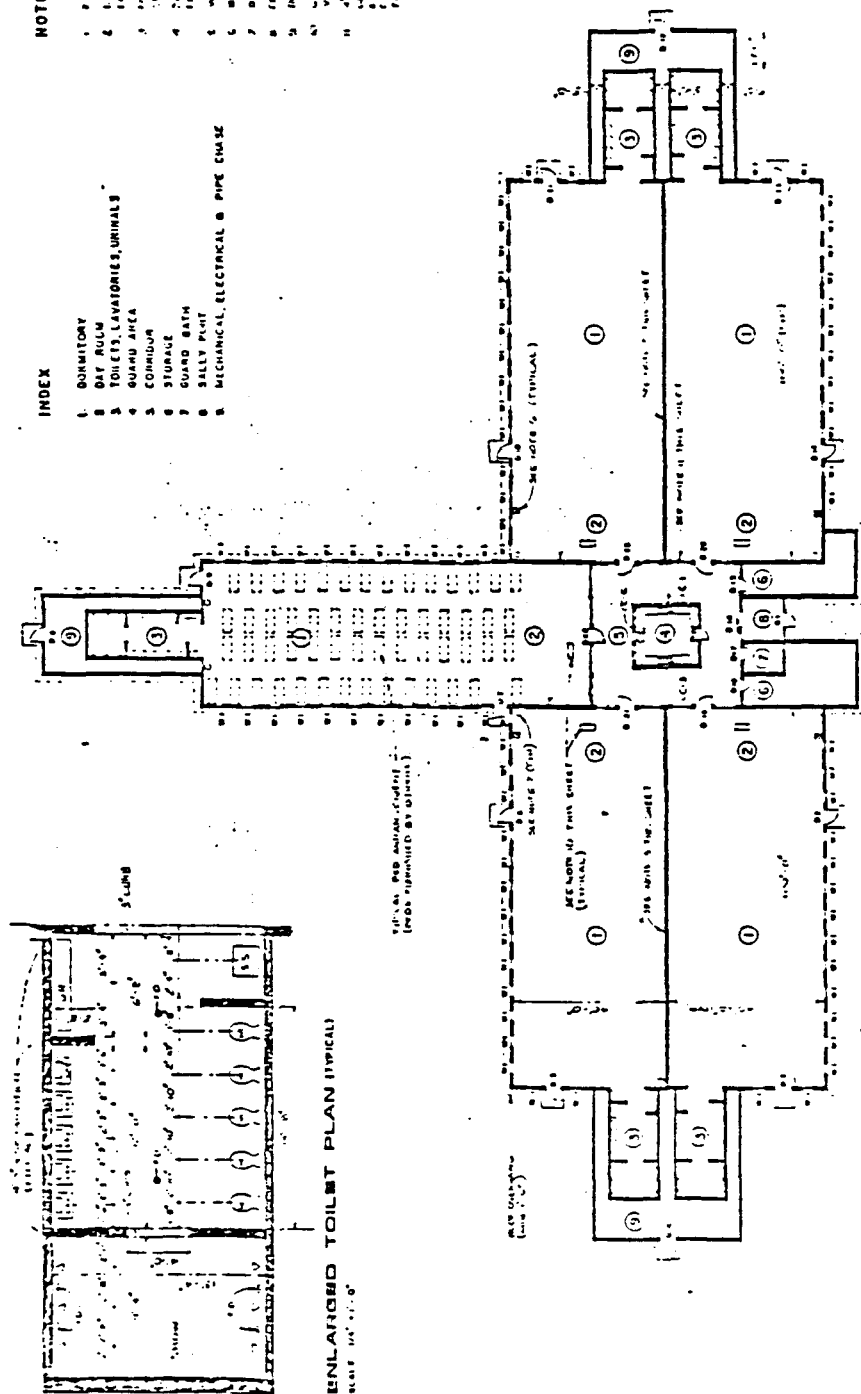

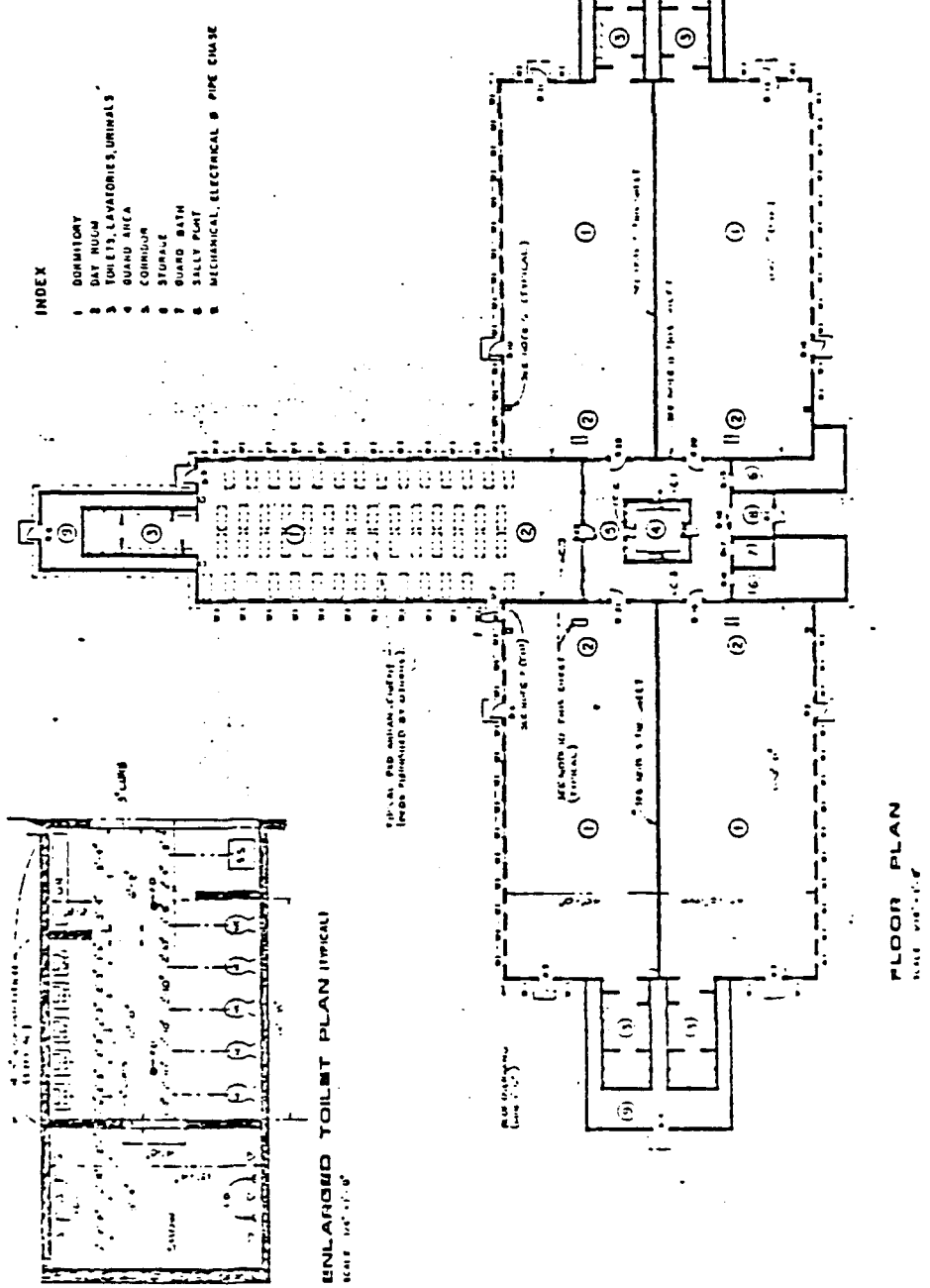

LOUISIANA CORRECTIONAL & INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL
(DEQUINCY)

I. Maximum Inmate Population

1.1 Maximum Present Inmate Population

The Department of Corrections ("DOC") agrees and stipulates that no more than 928 inmates are housed in existing housing areas at the Louisiana Correctional & Industrial School (DeQuincy) as of November 1, 1983. The DOC further agrees and stipulates that no more than 928 inmates shall be housed in the existing housing areas of DeQuincy at any time during the term or any extensions of the Stipulation and Consent Decree which became effective as of November 1, 1983 (the "Decree"). The DOC shall not be authorized to house inmates in the existing housing areas unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II, below, are maintained.

1.2 Maximum Increase in Populations

The DOC anticipates no increase in the maximum inmate population capacity at DeQuincy during the term, or any extensions, of the Decree.

II. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Present Inmate Population

2.1 DOC's right to house 928 inmates in existing housing areas at DeQuincy during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part II.

2.2 Distribution

The inmates housed at DeQuincy shall be distributed in dormitories as indicated below.

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2.3 Cellblock

Inmates shall be housed in the Cellblock only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any thirty day period.

No more than one inmate shall be housed in each cell of the Cellblock. The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in the Cellblock from the effective date of the Decree shall be 52.

2.4 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for the housing areas and cellblocks as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit C-1. However, prior to May 1, 1984, only three guards (one per shift) need be maintained for: (1) New Dorms 1-A, 1-B, 1-C and 1-D, and (2) New Dorms 2-A, 2-B, 2-C and 2-D.
- b. The purposes of the Decree may be satisfied by deployment of security guards in the housing areas and cellblocks in the manner designated on the site plans for DeQuincy which have been submitted to this Court as part of a separate Exhibit L. However, the warden may redeploy security guards within any housing area, provided that:
 - (i) there is no reduction in the total number of security guards within any housing area, and

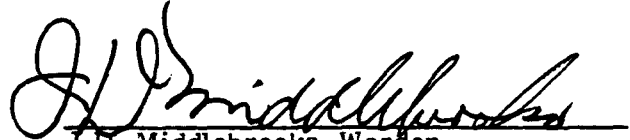
- (ii) the redeployment will more effectively assure prison safety and efficiency.
- c. In addition to the security guards assigned to housing areas and cell-blocks as indicated above, a minimum of 132 additional security guards shall be assigned to other areas of DeQuincy, assigned as "roving" security guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas or for custody and supervision of work crews. This additional number of security guards shall not include security guards assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency. However, only a minimum of 130 of these additional guards need be maintained prior to May 1, 1984.

2.5 Health and Medical Personnel

- a. The following health and medical personnel shall be employed on a full time basis:
 - 1 Physician IV
 - 1 Medical Records Technician (as of January 1, 1984)
 - 1 Registered Nurse III
 - 1 Registered Nurses II
 - 1 Practical Nurse III
 - 1 Practical Nurse II
- b. The following medical services shall be retained on a contract basis:
 - Physician (on call)
 - Pharmacist (15 hours/week)
 - Optometrist (2 hours/week)
 - Dentist (14 hours/week)
- c. In the event that health or medical personnel or services are terminated as a result of retirement, resignation or otherwise, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall initiate the procedure for filling the vacated position or contracting for the lost services. The warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall obtain replacement health and medical contract services on a temporary basis until the services are again under contract. If a health or medical position (whether personnel or contract services) does not remain vacant for more than 30 days, then, notwithstanding any provision of the Decree or this Exhibit, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall have no obligation to report such vacancy or obtain court authority for such vacancy.

III. Acknowledgment and Certification

I, J.D. Middlebrooks, warden of the Louisiana Correctional & Industrial School acknowledge that I have carefully read the Stipulation and Consent Decree and this Exhibit C. I certify that the information set forth in Exhibit C is, to the best of my knowledge, true and correct and accurately reflects existing conditions at the Louisiana Correctional & Industrial School. I further certify that if I become aware of a more effective method to accomplish the purposes of this Stipulation and Consent Decree, I will submit a written request for modification to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor. I further certify that if I become aware of any conditions at the Louisiana Correctional & Industrial School which violate the Stipulation and Consent Decree or any amendment thereto, or any conditions which would constitute cruel and unusual punishment, then I will immediately report such conditions to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor and to the Honorable Frank Polozola, Judge, United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana.

EXHIBIT D

LOUISIANA CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTE FOR WOMEN

I. Maximum Inmate Population

1.1 Maximum Present Inmate Population

The Department of Corrections ("DOC") agrees and stipulates that no more than 349 inmates are housed in existing housing areas at Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women (St. Gabriel) as of November 1, 1983. The DOC agrees and stipulates that no more than 349 inmates shall be housed in the existing housing areas of St. Gabriel during the term or any extension of the Stipulation and Consent Decree which became effective as of November 1, 1983 (the "Decree"), except as authorized in Part III of this Exhibit D. The DOC shall not be authorized to house inmates in the existing housing areas unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II, below, are maintained.

1.2 Maximum Increase in Population - Aquarius

The DOC agrees and stipulates that during the term or any extension of the Decree no more than 77 inmates shall be housed in the new Pre-release Dormitory, no more than 48 inmates shall be housed in new Cellblock A, no more than 24 inmates shall be housed in the permanent lockdown section of Cellblock B, and no more than 198 additional inmates shall be housed in Aquarius Dormitory. The DOC shall not be authorized to house any inmates in the new Pre-release Dormitory, the new Cellblock A, or the new Cellblock B, and shall not be authorized to house any additional inmates in Aquarius Dormitory unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part III, below, are maintained.

II. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Present Inmate Population

2.1 DOC's right to house 349 inmates in existing housing areas at St. Gabriel during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part II.

2.2 Distribution

The inmates housed at St. Gabriel are now distributed in dormitories as indicated below.

2.3 Cellblocks

Inmates shall be housed in the Aquarius and Gemini Cellblocks only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment, or (5) protective custody. Additionally, until Cellblock A has been constructed and is available for use, the Aquarius and Gemini Cellblocks may be used for extended lockdown. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any 30 day period.

The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in the Aquarius and Gemini Cellblocks from the effective date of the Decree shall be eight in Aquarius and 16 in Gemini. No more than one inmate shall be housed in each cell of the Gemini Cellblock. If deemed necessary by the warden, up to two inmates may be housed in each cell of the Aquarius Cellblock on a temporary basis until May 31, 1984, provided that no inmate shall be housed in a cell with another inmate for more than 45 days in any 90 day period. Not later than May 15, 1984, the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of St. Gabriel shall submit to the Court a written report describing the experience of housing two inmates in individual cells at of Aquarius during the period from November 1, 1983 through April 30, 1984. The report shall state whether it remains necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, and, if so, the report shall propose reasonable time or other limitations on the practice of housing two inmates in individual cells. Upon receipt of a report stating that it remains necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, the Court shall enter an order accepting the proposal of the Secretary of the DOC and the warden, or designating additional or more stringent limitations.

2.4 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for the housing areas and cellblocks as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit D-1.
- b. The purposes of the Decree may be satisfied by deployment of security guards in the housing areas and cellblocks in the manner designated on the site plans for St. Gabriel which have been submitted to this Court as part of a separate Exhibit L. However, the warden may redeploy security guards within any housing area, provided that:

- (i) ~~there~~ there is no reduction in the total number of security guards within any housing area, and
 - (ii) the redeployment will more effectively assure prison safety and efficiency.
- c. In addition to the security guards assigned to housing areas and cell-blocks as indicated above, a minimum of 48 additional security guards shall be assigned to other areas of St. Gabriel, assigned as "roving" security guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas. At any given time, no more than five of these additional security guards shall be assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

2.5 Health and Medical Personnel

- a. The following health and medical personnel shall be employed on a full time basis:

- 1 Registered Nurse III
- 3 Registered Nurses II
- 2 Practical Nurses III
- 1 Physician III (shared with Hunt Correctional Center-15 hours per week will be spent at St. Gabriel)
- 1 Dental Hygienist (shared with Hunt Correctional Center-10 hours per week will be spent at St. Gabriel)
- 1 Pharmacist II (shared with Hunt Correctional Center-30 hours per week will be spent at St. Gabriel)

Additionally, mental health personnel shall be maintained at St. Gabriel as necessary to provide mental health services at least equivalent to mental health services now being provided.

- b. The following medical services shall be retained on a contract basis:

- Psychiatrist (9 hours/week)
- Optometrist (2.5 hours/week)
- OB/GYN (3 hours/week)
- Dentist (20 hours/week)

- c. In the event that health or medical personnel or services are terminated as a result of retirement, resignation or otherwise, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall initiate the procedure for filling the vacated position or contracting for the lost services. The warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall obtain replacement health

and medical contract services on a temporary basis until the services are again under contract. If a health or medical position (whether personnel or contract services) does not remain vacant for more than 30 days, then, notwithstanding any provision of the Decree or this Exhibit, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall have no obligation to report such vacancy or obtain court authority for such vacancy.

III. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Use of the Pre-release Dormitory, Cellblock A, and Cellblock B, and for increases in Aquarius Dormitory

3.1 The DOC's right to house 77 inmates in the Pre-release Dorm, 48 inmates in Cellblock A, 24 inmates in the permanent lockdown section of Cellblock B, and 198 additional inmates in Aquarius during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part III. Some of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part III apply only to restrict the housing of inmates in specified housing areas. Conditions, limitations and standards which apply only to specified housing areas shall not be interpreted so as to restrict the DOC's right to house additional inmates in other housing areas. Except where specifically limited in this manner, however, the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part must be maintained in order to house any inmates in the Pre-release Dorm, Cellblock A, or the permanent lockdown section of Cellblock B or to house any additional inmates in Aquarius Dorm.

3.2 Maintenance of Existing Conditions, Limitations and Standards

All conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II of this Exhibit D are and shall continue to be maintained, except as modified in paragraph 3.3, below.

3.3 Distribution

a. Pre-release Dormitory

No more than 77 inmates shall be housed in the New Pre-release Dorm. To the extent inmates are placed in the Pre-release Dormitory, the entirety of the Gemini Annex and the Aquarius Annex shall no longer be used for housing inmates. The 77 inmates housed in the Pre-release Dormitory shall therefore represent an increase in the overall inmate population at St. Gabriel of only ten inmates.

b. Cellblock A

No more than 48 inmates shall be housed in Cellblock A.

c. Aquarius Dormitory

All 198 additional inmates assigned to Aquarius Dormitory shall be housed in Sections A, B, C, D, E and F. Up to 33 additional inmates (or a total of 66 inmates) may be housed in each of Sections

A, B, ~~C~~, D, E and F of Aquarius Dormitory. In no event shall the entire population of Aquarius exceed 396 (excluding the cellblock area).

d. Cellblock B

No more than 24 inmates shall be housed in that one-half of Cellblock B reserved for permanent lockdown.

3.4 New Construction

a. Pre-release Dorm and Cellblock A

No inmates shall be housed in the Pre-release Dorm until it has been constructed and is available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit D-2(1). No inmates shall be housed in the Cellblock A until it has been constructed and is available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit D-2(2).

b. Cellblock B-Disciplinary Units

Inmates may be housed in the Pre-release Dorm and Cellblock A prior to the construction of the Disciplinary Units of Cellblock B. However, no additional inmates shall be housed in Aquarius Dorm until the Disciplinary Units of Cellblock B are constructed and available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit D-2(3).

3.5 Use of Disciplinary Units of Cellblock B

Inmates shall be housed in Cellblock B only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment, or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any 30 day period.

In the event that the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of St. Gabriel determine that it is necessary to house two inmates in individual cells of the disciplinary units of Cellblock B, then a proposal incorporating reasonable time or other limitations on the practice of housing two inmates in individual cells shall be made part of the Certificate of Compliance filed in accordance with paragraph 3.8 of this Consent Decree. Upon receipt of a Certificate of Compliance stating that it is necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, the Court shall enter an order accepting the proposal of the Secretary of the DOC and the warden, or designating additional or more stringent requirements. The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in the disciplinary units of Cellblock B shall be 24 or 48, depending on whether double celling is permitted.

3.6 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for the Pre-release Dorm and Cellblocks A and B as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit D-1, provided, however, that security assignments need not be maintained for housing areas or cellblocks which are not being used.
- b. Before any additional inmates are housed in sections A, B, C, D, E or F of Aquarius Dormitory, security assignments must be increased for that section as indicated in the chart attached as Exhibit D-1, provided, however, that security assignments for a given section need not be increased until the warden or the DOC seeks to house additional inmates in that section.
- c. In addition to the security guards assigned to the Pre-release Dorm, Cellblock A, Cellblock B, and Aquarius Dormitory, as designated above, additional security guards (in addition to the 48 security guards required under Subparagraph 2.4(c) of this Exhibit) shall be assigned to other areas of St. Gabriel at all times as follows: A minimum of 15 additional security guards shall ultimately be assigned to other areas of St. Gabriel, assigned as "roving" guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas. The DOC need not maintain assignment of all 15 additional guards in the event that only some of the new or renovated living areas are utilized, provided that enough additional security guards are maintained to assure prison safety. These additional security guards shall not include security guards assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

3.7 Health and Medical Personnel

It is anticipated that the inmate population of St. Gabriel will be increased gradually during the next five years. The following additional health and medical personnel shall be employed on a full time basis or retained on a contract basis as indicated:

- a. Before the total population of St. Gabriel exceeds 397 inmates, one additional practical Nurse (for a total of 3) shall be employed, and St. Gabriel shall have the services of the full time physician shared with Hunt Correctional Center (paragraph 2.5 (C), above), for an additional 8 hours/week, for a total of 23 hours/week.

Additionally, the following contractual services shall be retained:

Psychiatrist-3 hrs/wk (for a total of 12 hrs/wk)
OBGYN-2 hrs/wk (for a total of 5 hrs/wk)
Optometrist-2 1/2 hrs/wk (for a total of 5 hrs/wk)
Dentist 8 hours/week (for a total of 28 hours/week)

- b. Before the total population of St. Gabriel exceeds 419 inmates, one additional pharmacy assistant shall be employed, and St. Gabriel shall have (1) the services of the full time physician shared with Hunt Correctional Center (paragraph 2.5 (a), above) for an additional 10 hours/week, for a total of 33 hours/week, and (2) the services of the full time Dental Hygienist shared with Hunt Correctional Center (paragraph 2.5 (a), above) for an additional 5 hours/week, for a total of 15 hours/week. Additionally, the following contractual services shall be retained:

Psychiatrist-3 hrs/wk (for a total of 15 hrs/wk)
OBGYN-3 hrs/wk (for a total of 8 hrs/wk)
Optometrist-2 1/2 hrs/wk (for a total of 7 1/2 hrs/wk)
Dentist-8 hours/week (for a total of 36 hours/week).

- c. Before the total population of St. Gabriel exceeds 452 inmates, one full time physician (in lieu of the Physician shared with Hunt Correctional Center), one dentist (in lieu of contract services of a dentist), one Registered Nurse II (for a total of 4), and one medical technician shall be employed, and St. Gabriel shall have the services of the full time Dental Hygienist shared with Hunt Correctional Center (paragraph 2.5(a), above) for an additional 5 hours/week, for a total of 20 hours/week. Additionally, the following contractual services shall be retained:

Psychiatrist-3 hrs/wk (for a total of 18 hrs/wk)
Optometrist-3 1/2 hrs/wk (for a total of 11 hrs/wk)

- d. Before the total population of St. Gabriel exceeds 485 inmates, one additional Registered Nurse II (for a total of 5), one X-ray Technician, and one medical technician shall be employed. Additionally, the following additional contractual services shall be retained:

Psychiatrist-2 hrs/wk (for a total of 20 hrs/wk)
OBGYN-2 hrs/wk (for a total of 10 hrs/wk)
Optometrist-4 hrs/wk (for a total of 15 hrs/wk)

Additionally, in conjunction with any population increase, mental health personnel and contract services shall be maintained and increased at St. Gabriel as necessary to provide mental health services at least equivalent to mental health services now being provided.

- 3.8 Not less than 15 days before the date any inmates are housed in the Pre-release Dorm, Cellblock A or Cellblock B, or any before additional inmates are housed in Aquarius Dormitory, the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of St. Gabriel shall file with the Court a Certification of Compliance, in the form and substance of Exhibit D-3(1) (Pre-release Dorm, Cellblock A or Cellblock B) or in the form and substance of Exhibit D-3(2) (Aquarius Dormitory), certifying that the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Exhibit D have been met. Increases in the inmate population of Aquarius Dorm may be made in the increments set forth in

paragraph 3.6, above; in which event a separate Certificate of Compliance shall be filed with the Court for each incremental increase.

IV. Acknowledgment and Certification

I, Johnnie Jones, warden of Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women, acknowledge that I have carefully read the Stipulation and Consent Decree and this Exhibit D. I certify that the information set forth in Exhibit D is, to the best of my knowledge, true and correct and accurately reflects existing conditions at Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women. I further certify that if I become aware of a more effective method to accomplish the purposes of the Stipulation and Consent Decree, I will submit a written request for modification to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor. I further certify that if I become aware of any conditions at Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women which violate the Stipulation and Consent Decree or any amendment thereto, or any conditions which would constitute cruel and unusual punishment, then I will immediately report such conditions to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor and to the Honorable Frank Polozola, Judge, United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana.

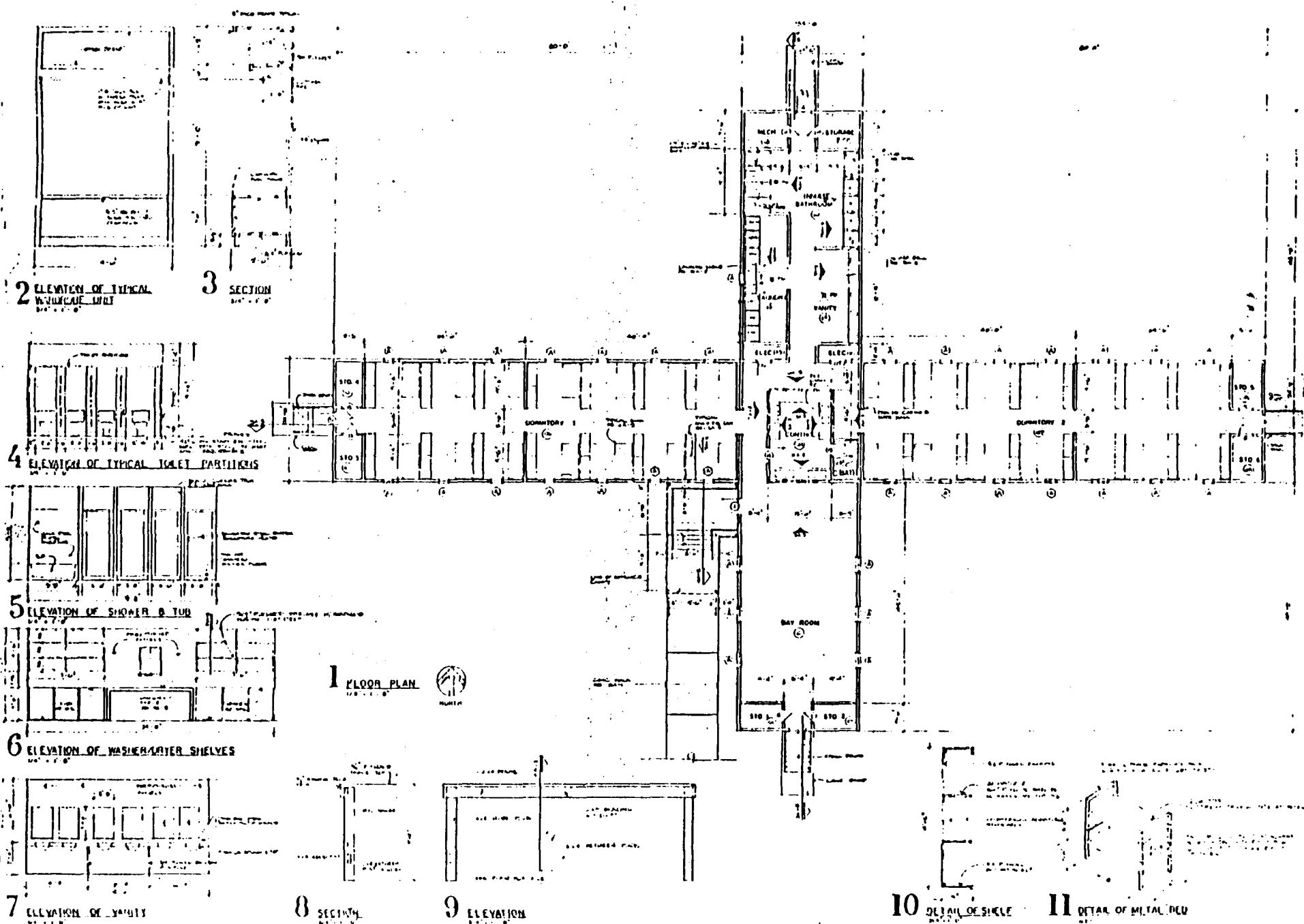

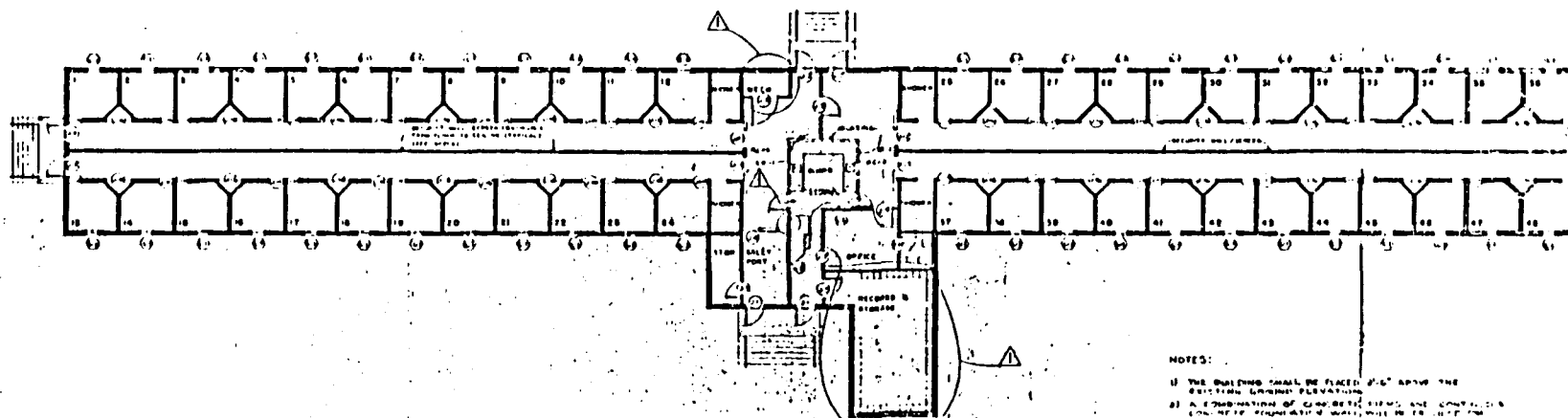

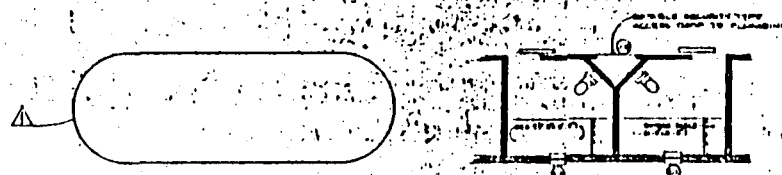
Architectural drawing of the Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women, Pre-Release Dorm. The drawing includes a title block with the following information:

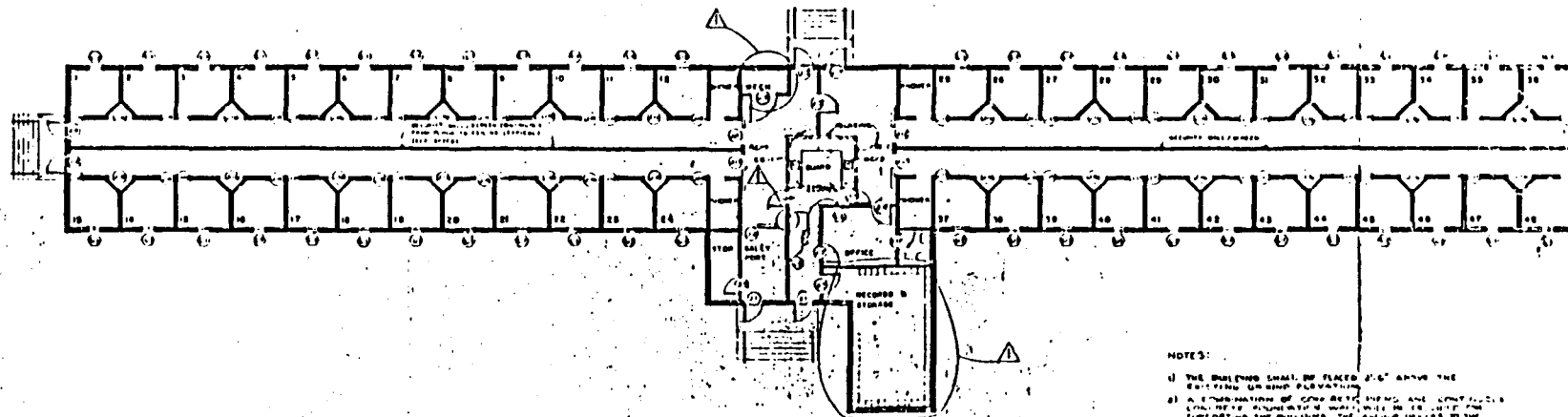

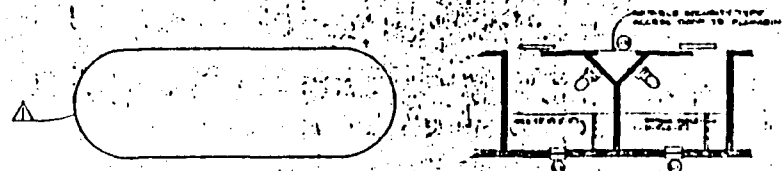
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FLOOR PLAN

EXHIBIT E

LOUISIANA STATE PENITENTIARY

I. Maximum Inmate Population

1.1 Maximum Present Inmate Population

The Department of Corrections ("DOC") agrees and stipulates that no more than 4747 inmates are housed in existing housing areas at Louisiana State Penitentiary (Angola) as of November 1, 1983. The DOC further agrees and stipulates that no more than 4747 inmates shall be housed in the existing housing areas of Angola at any time during the term or any extensions of the Stipulation and Consent Decree which became effective as of November 1, 1983 (the "Decree"), except as authorized in Part III of this Exhibit E. The DOC shall not be authorized to house inmates in the existing housing areas unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II, below, are maintained.

1.2 Maximum Increase in Populations

The DOC agrees and stipulates that during the term or any extension of the Decree no more than 5200 inmates shall be housed in Angola upon completion of renovations and additional housing as set forth in paragraph 3.3 of this Exhibit E, below. The DOC shall not be authorized to house any additional inmates in Angola unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part III, below, are maintained.

II. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Present Inmate Population

2.1 DOC's right to house 4747 inmates in existing housing areas at Angola during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part II.

2.2 Distribution

The inmates housed at Angola are now distributed in dormitories and cellblocks as indicated below. The indicated distribution is subject to modification upon completion of renovations as set forth in paragraph 3.3 of this Exhibit.

2.3 Cellblocks

Inmates shall be housed in the administrative and disciplinary cellblocks at Angola only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment, or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any 30 day period.

The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in the administrative and disciplinary cellblocks at Angola from the effective date of the Decree shall be 518, distributed as follows:

If deemed necessary by the warden, up to two inmates may be housed in each cell of the cellblocks listed above on a temporary basis until May 31, 1984, provided that no inmate shall be housed in a cell with another inmate for more than 45 days in any 90 day period. Not later than May 15, 1984, the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of Angola shall submit to the Court a written report describing the experience of housing two inmates in individual cells at Angola during the period from November 1, 1983 through April 30, 1984. The report shall state whether it

remains necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, and, if so, the report shall propose reasonable time or other limitations on the practice of housing two inmates in individual cells. Upon receipt of a report stating that it remains necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, the Court shall enter an order accepting the proposal of the Secretary of the DOC and the warden, or designating additional or more stringent limitations.

2.4 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for the housing areas and cellblocks as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit E-1.
- b. The purposes of the Decree may be satisfied by deployment of security guards in the housing areas and cellblocks in the manner designated on the site plans for Angola which have been submitted to this Court as part of a separate Exhibit L. However, the warden may redeploy security guards within any housing area, provided that:
 - (i) there is no reduction in the total number of security guards within any housing area, and
 - (ii) the redeployment will more effectively assure prison safety and efficiency.
- c. In addition to the security guards assigned to housing areas and cellblocks as indicated above, a minimum of 697 additional security guards shall be assigned to other areas of Angola, assigned as "roving" security guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas. This additional number of security guards shall not include security guards assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

2.5 Health and Medical Personnel

- a. The following health and medical personnel shall be employed on a full time basis:

Additionally, mental health personnel shall be maintained at Angola as necessary to provide mental health services at least equivalent to mental health services now being provided.

b. The following medical services shall be retained on a contract basis:

Physician (16 hours/week)
Radiologist (4 hours/week)
Optometrist (8 hours/week)
Oral Surgeon (12 hours/week)
Medical Records Librarian (4 hrs/week)
Lab Services (11 tests/week)
Ophthalmologist (1.5 hours/week)
Psychiatrist (16 hours/week)(or full time psychiatrist, above)

Additionally, mental health contract services shall be maintained at Angola as necessary to provide mental health services at least equivalent to mental health services now being provided.

c. In the event that health or medical personnel or services are terminated as a result of retirement, resignation or otherwise, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall initiate the procedure for filling the vacated position or contracting for the lost services. The warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall obtain replacement health and medical contract services on a temporary basis until the services are again under contract. If a health or medical position (whether personnel or contract services) does not remain vacant for more than 30 days, then, notwithstanding any provision of the Decree or this Exhibit, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall have no obligation to report such vacancy or obtain court authority for such vacancy.

III. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Increases in Inmate Population

3.1 The DOC's right to house 453 additional inmates in renovated or newly constructed housing areas of Angola during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part III. Some of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part III apply only to restrict the housing of inmates in specified housing areas. Conditions, limitations and standards which apply only to

specified housing areas shall not be interpreted so as to restrict the DOC's right to house additional inmates in other housing areas. Except where specifically limited in this manner, however, the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part must be maintained in order to house any additional inmates in the newly constructed or renovated housing areas of Angola.

3.2 Maintenance of Existing Conditions, Limitations and Standards

All conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II of this Exhibit E are and shall continue to be maintained.

3.3 Distribution

Additional inmates shall be housed in renovated or newly constructed housing areas of Angola as indicated below:

a. Main Prison-Renovation of Oak Dormitory

Up to 240 additional inmates may be housed in Oak Dormitory of the Main Prison upon renovation of Oak Dormitory in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit E-2(1). After renovation, additional inmates shall be housed in Oak Dormitory as follows:

Up to 78 additional inmates may be housed in Hawk Dormitory of Camp D upon its conversion to a working cellblock in accordance

with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit E-2(3).

d. Main Prison - Cellblocks B & C

Up to 15 additional inmates (for a total of 135 inmates) may be housed in Cellblocks B & C of the Main Prison upon the conversion of Cellblock B to a working cellblock and the conversion of Cellblock C to permanent lockdown and disciplinary cells, in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit E-2(4). Cellblock B shall house up to 120 inmates as a working cellblock. Cellblock C shall house up to 15 inmates in that portion of the cellblock dedicated to permanent lockdown. Upon conversion of Cellblock B & C, inmates shall be housed in Cellblocks B & C as follows:

e. Renovation of Reception Center

The overall total number of inmates which may be housed in the Reception Center shall be reduced from 107 to 102 upon its renovation in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit E-2(5). The distribution of the inmate population in the Reception Center after renovation shall be as follows:

Upon renovation of the Reception Center the second floor shall be converted to a Mental Health Unit.

3.4 New Construction

a. Oak Dormitory

No inmates shall be housed in Oak Dormitory until the Oak Temporary Cellblock has been constructed and is available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit E-2(7). No inmate shall be housed in Oak Dormitory after July 1, 1984 unless Cellblocks X-1, X-2, and X-3 have been constructed and are available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit E-2(6).

b. Reception Center - New Cellblock

No inmates shall be housed in the Reception Center - New Cellblock until it has been constructed and is available for use in its entirety (including 120 cells for extended lockdown and 60 disciplinary cells) in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit E-2(2).

c. Camp D - Hawk Cellblock

No additional inmates shall be housed in Hawk Cellblock until the renovation of the existing Reception Center has been completed in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit E-2(5).

d. Main Prison - Cellblock Renovation

No additional inmates shall be housed in the Main Prison Cellblocks until Cellblocks X-1, X-2, and X-3 have been constructed and are available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit E-2(6).

e. Existing Reception Center

The renovation of the Existing Reception Center shall not commence until the Reception Center - New Cellblock has been constructed and is available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit E-2(2).

3.5 Use of Cellblocks

Inmates shall be housed in the newly renovated or newly constructed administrative and disciplinary cells at Angola only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment, or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any 30 day period.

In the event that the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of Angola determine that it is necessary to house two inmates in individual cells of the newly renovated or newly constructed administrative and disciplinary cells, then a proposal incorporating reasonable time or other limitations on the practice of housing two inmates in individual cells shall be made part of the Certificate of Compliance filed in accordance with paragraph 3.8 of this Consent Decree. Upon receipt of a Certificate of Compliance stating that it is necessary to house two inmates in individual cells, the Court shall enter an order accepting the proposal of the Secretary of the DOC and the warden, or designating additional or more stringent requirements. The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in the newly renovated or newly constructed disciplinary cells shall be 317 or 634, depending on whether double celling is permitted. If double celling is not permitted then the inmates shall be distributed as follows:

3.6 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for all renovated or newly constructed areas of Angola as indicated in Exhibit E-1, provided, however, that security assignments need not be maintained for housing areas or cellblocks which are not being used; and provided, further, that security assignments for existing areas need not be increased until those areas have been renovated and the DOC seeks to house additional inmates in those areas.
- b. In addition to the security guards assigned to the renovated or newly constructed housing areas and cellblocks, as designated above, a minimum of 85 additional security guards (in addition to the 697 security guards required under Subparagraph 2.4(c) of this Exhibit) shall be assigned to other areas of Angola, assigned as "roving" guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas. These additional security guards shall not include security guards assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

3.7 Health and Medical Personnel

Health and medical personnel, including mental health personnel, shall be maintained and increased at Angola as necessary to provide services at least equivalent to the health and medical services now being provided. Specifically, the following additional health and medical personnel shall be employed on a full time basis no later than January 31, 1984.

1 Physician IV (for a total of four)
 2 Physician II (for a total of two)(in lieu of 16 hours contract services of Physician)

- 3.8 Not less than 15 days before the date any inmates are housed in the renovated/constructed areas of Angola, the Secretary of the DOC and the warden

of Angola shall file with the Court of these proceedings, a Certification of Compliance, in the form and substance of Exhibit E-3, certifying that the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Exhibit E have been met. Increases in the inmate population may be made in increments corresponding to the renovation or new construction of housing units as set forth in paragraph 3.3, above, and a separate Certificate of Compliance (Exhibit E-3) shall be filed with the Court for each such incremental increase.

IV. Acknowledgment and Certification

I, Ross Maggio, warden of Louisiana State Penitentiary, acknowledge that I have carefully read the Stipulation and Consent Decree and this Exhibit E. I certify that the information set forth in Exhibit E is, to the best of my knowledge, true and correct and accurately reflects existing conditions at Louisiana State Penitentiary. I further certify that if I become aware of a more effective method to accomplish the purposes of the Stipulation and Consent Decree, I will submit a written request for modification to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor. I further certify that if I become aware of any conditions at Louisiana State Penitentiary which violate the Stipulation and Consent Decree or any amendment thereto, or any conditions which would constitute cruel and unusual punishment, then I will immediately report such conditions to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor and to the Honorable Frank Polozola, Judge, United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana.

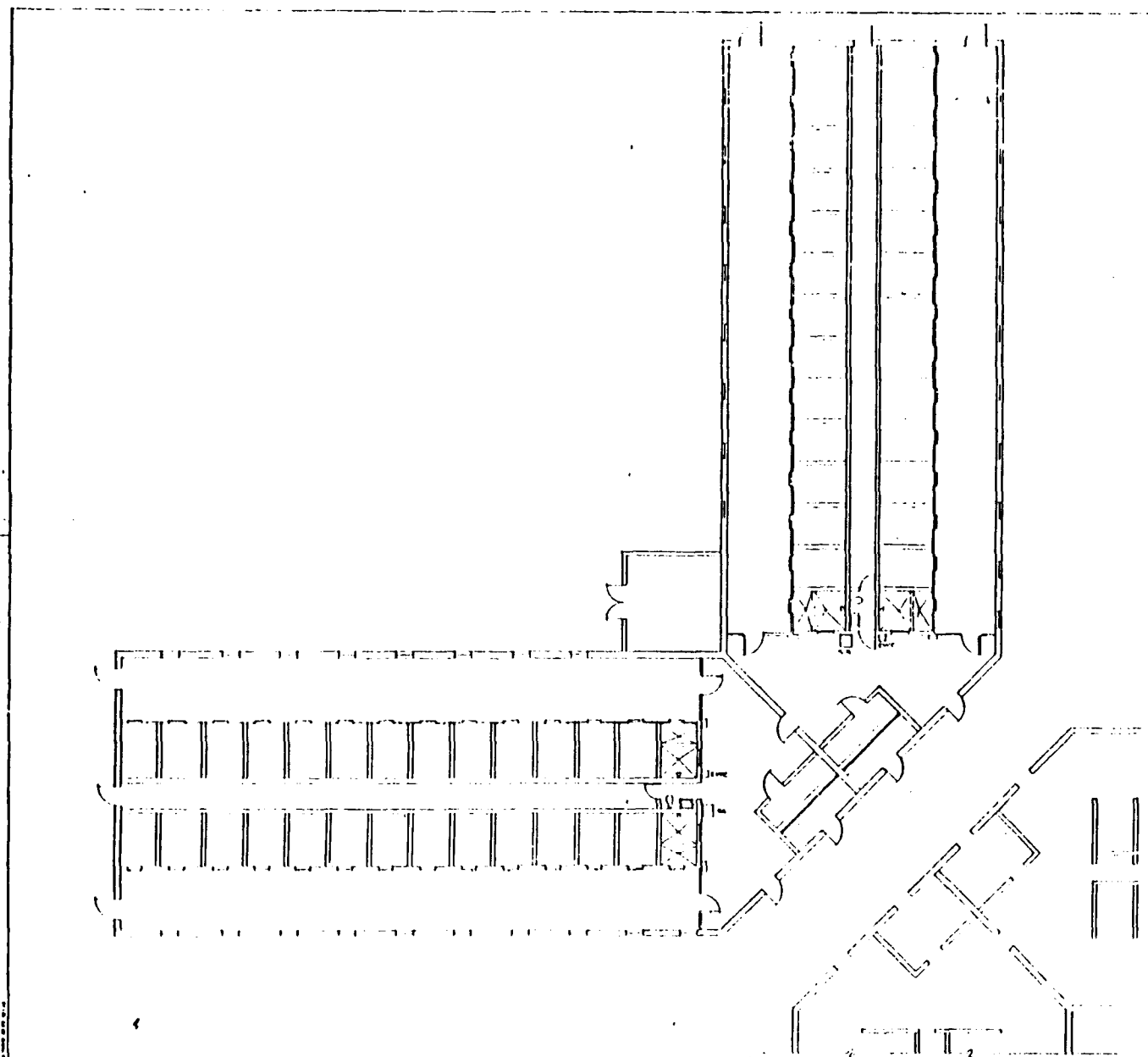

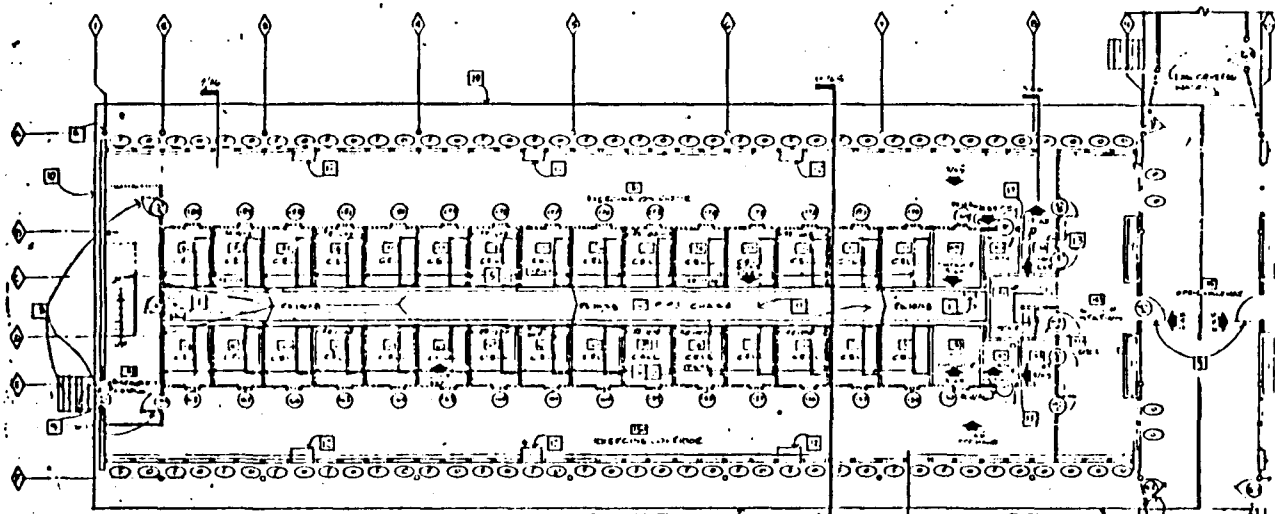

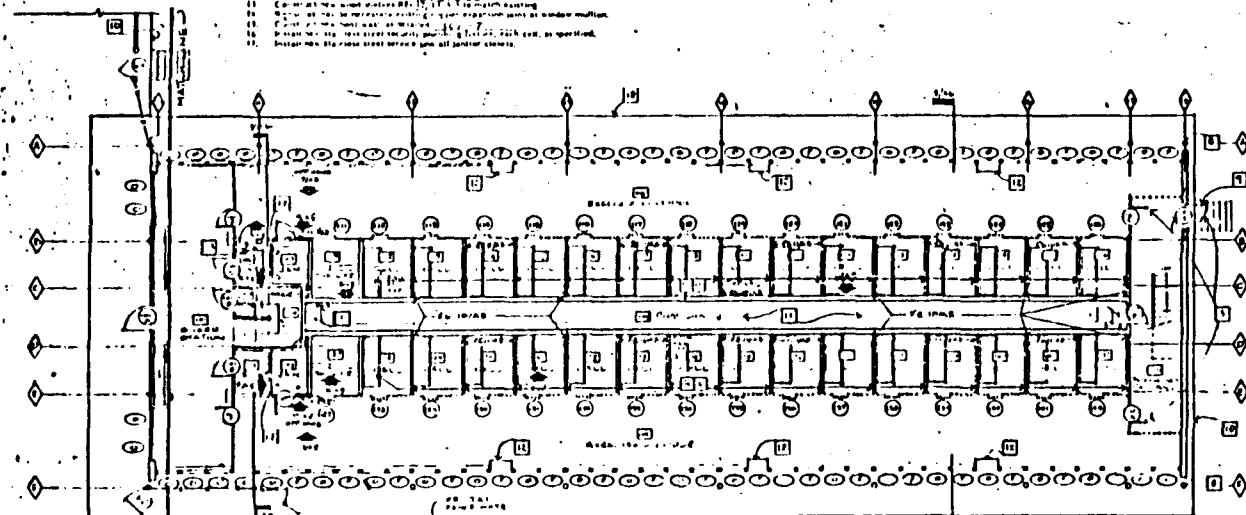

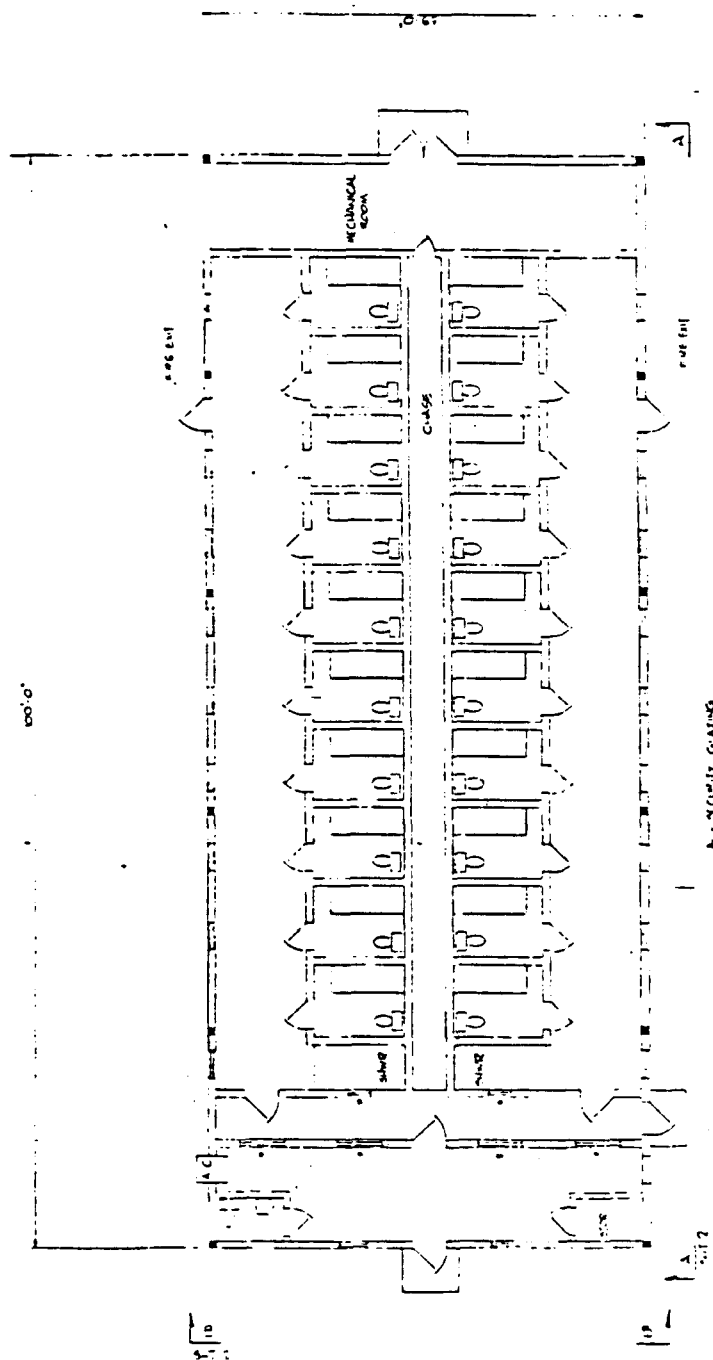

I. Maximum Inmate Population

1.1 Maximum Present Inmate Population

The DOC agrees and stipulates that no more than 626 inmates are housed in existing housing areas at Wade Correctional Center (Wade) as of November 1, 1983. The DOC further agrees and stipulates that no more than 626 inmates shall be housed in the existing housing areas of Wade at any time during the term, or any extensions, of the Stipulation and Consent Decree, which became effective as of November 1, 1983 (the "Decree"). The DOC shall not be authorized to house inmates in the existing housing areas unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II, below, are maintained.

1.2 Maximum Increase in Populations

The DOC agrees and stipulates that during the term or any extension of the Decree no more than 289 inmates shall be housed in Dorm I (expected completion date - July 24, 1984) and no more than 289 inmates shall be housed in Dorm II (expected completion date - July 24, 1984). The DOC shall not be authorized to house any inmates in Dorm I or Dorm II unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part III, below, are maintained.

II. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Present Inmate Population

2.1 DOC's right to house 626 inmates in existing housing areas at Wade during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part II.

2.2 Distribution

The inmates housed at Wade shall be distributed in dormitories as indicated below:

2.3 Cellblocks A and B

Inmates shall be housed in Cellblocks A and B only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any thirty day period.

No more than one inmate shall be housed in each cell of Cellblocks A and B. The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in Cellblocks A and B from the effective date of the Decree shall be 26, distributed as follows:

Cellblock A	13
Cellblock B	13

2.4 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for the housing areas and cellblocks as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit F-1.
- b. The purposes of the Decree may be satisfied by deployment of security guards in the housing areas and cellblocks in the manner designated on the site plans for Wade which have been submitted to this Court as part of a separate Exhibit L. However, the warden may redeploy security guards within any housing area, provided that:
 - (i) there is no reduction in the total number of security guards within any housing area, and
 - (ii) the redeployment will more effectively assure prison safety and efficiency.
- c. In addition to the security guards assigned to housing areas and cellblocks as indicated above, a minimum of 133 additional security guards shall be assigned to other areas of Wade, assigned as "roving" security guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas. At any given time, no more than five of these additional security guards shall be assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

2.5 Health and Medical Personnel

- a. The following health and medical personnel shall be employed on a full time basis:

1 Registered Nurse III
4 Registered Nurses II
3 Medical Specialist II
1 Physician IV
1 Medical Records Technician

- b. The following medical services shall be retained on a contract basis:

Dentist (10 hours/week)
Pharmacist (12 hours/week)
Optometrist (4 hours/month)
Radiographer (6 hours/week)

- c. In the event that health or medical personnel or services are terminated as a result of retirement, resignation or otherwise, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall initiate the procedure for filling the vacated position or contracting for the lost services. The warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall obtain replacement health and medical contract services on a temporary basis until the services are again under contract. If a health or medical position (whether personnel or contract services) does not remain vacant for more than 30 days, then, notwithstanding any provision of the Decree or this Exhibit, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall have no obligation to report such vacancy or obtain court authority for such vacancy.

III. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Increase in Inmate Population

- 3.1 The DOC's right to house 289 inmates in New Dorm I and 289 inmates in New Dorm II during the term, or any extension, of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part III. Some of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part III apply only to restrict the housing of inmates in specified housing areas. Conditions, limitations and standards which apply only to specified housing areas shall not be interpreted so as to restrict the DOC's right to house additional inmates in other housing areas. Except where specifically limited in this manner, however, the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part must be maintained in order to house any additional inmates in New Dorm I or New Dorm II.

- 3.2 Maintenance of Existing Conditions, Limitations and Standards

All conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II of this Exhibit F are and shall continue to be maintained.

3.4 New Construction

a. New Dorm I and New Dorm II

No inmates shall be housed in New Dorm I until it has been constructed and is available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit F-2(1). No inmates shall be housed in New Dorm II until it has been constructed and is available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit F-2(1).

b. New Cellblocks

No inmates shall be housed in either New Dorm I or New Dorm II until New Cellblocks A, B and C have been constructed and are available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit F-2(2). Additionally, no inmates shall be housed in New Dorm II until New Cellblocks D, E and F have been constructed and are available for use in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit F-2(2).

3.5 Use of New Cellblocks A, B, C, D, E, and F

Inmates shall be housed in New Cellblocks A, B, C, D, E and F only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any thirty day period.

No more than one inmate shall be housed in each cell of New Cellblocks A, B, C, D, E and F. The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in Cellblocks A, B, C, D, E and F from the effective date of the Decree shall be 64, distributed as follows:

New Cellblock A - 12
New Cellblock B - 12
New Cellblock C - 8
New Cellblock D - 8
New Cellblock E - 12
New Cellblock F - 12

3.6 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for New Dorm I, New Dorm II and New Cellblocks A, B, C, D, E, and F, as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit F-1; provided, however, that security assignments need not be maintained for housing areas or cellblocks which are not being used.
- b. In addition to the security guards assigned to Dorm I and Dorm II and New Cellblocks A, B, C, D, E, and F, as designated above, a minimum of 90 additional security guards (in addition to the 133 security guards required under Subparagraph 2.4(e) of this Exhibit) shall be assigned to other areas of Wade, assigned as "roving" guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas. The DOC need not maintain assignment of all 90 additional guards in the event that only some of the new living areas are utilized, provided that enough additional security guards are assigned to assure prison safety. These additional security guards shall not include security guards assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

3.7 Health and Medical Personnel

- a. The following additional health and medical personnel (in addition to the health and medical personnel required under Subparagraph 2.5(a) of this Exhibit) shall be employed on a full time basis:

5 Registered Nurse II (a total of nine Registered Nurse II)

- b. The following additional health and medical personnel (in addition to the health and medical personnel required under Subparagraph 2.5(b) of this Exhibit) shall be retained on a contract basis during fiscal year 1983-1984 and thereafter:

Dentist (10 additional hours/week for a total of 20 hours/week)
Pharmacist (2 additional hours/week for a total of 14 hours/week)
Radiologist (2 additional hours/week for a total of 8 hours/week)
Optometrist (8 additional hours/month for a total of 16 hours/month)

- 3.8 Not less than 15 days before the date any inmates are housed in Dorm I or Dorm II, the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of Wade shall file with the Court of these

Dentist (10 additional hours/week for a total of 20 hours/week)
Pharmacist (2 additional hours/week for a total of 14 hours/week)
Radiologist (2 additional hours/week for a total of 8 hours/week)
Optometrist (8 additional hours/month for a total of 16 hours/month)

- 3.8 Not less than 15 days before the date any inmates are housed in Dorm I or Dorm II, the Secretary of the DOC and the warden of Wade shall file with the Court of these proceedings, a Certification of Compliance, in the form and substance of Exhibit F-3, certifying that the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Exhibit F have been met. A separate Certification of Compliance may be submitted for New Dorm I and New Dorm II certifying that all conditions, limitations and standards pertinent to the individual housing area have been met.

IV. Acknowledgment and Certification

I, Donald R. Guillory, warden of Wade Correctional Center, acknowledge that I have carefully read the Stipulation and Consent Decree and this Exhibit F. I certify that the information set forth in Exhibit F is, to the best of my knowledge, true and correct and accurately reflects existing conditions at Wade Correctional Center. I further certify that if I become aware of a more effective method to accomplish the purposes of the Stipulation and Consent Decree, I will submit a written request for modification to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor. I further certify that if I become aware of any conditions at Wade Correctional Center which violate the Stipulation and Consent Decree or any amendment thereto, or any conditions which would constitute cruel and unusual punishment, then I will immediately report such conditions to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor and to the Honorable Frank Polozola, Judge, United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana.

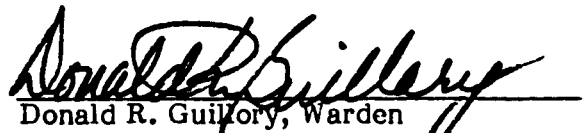

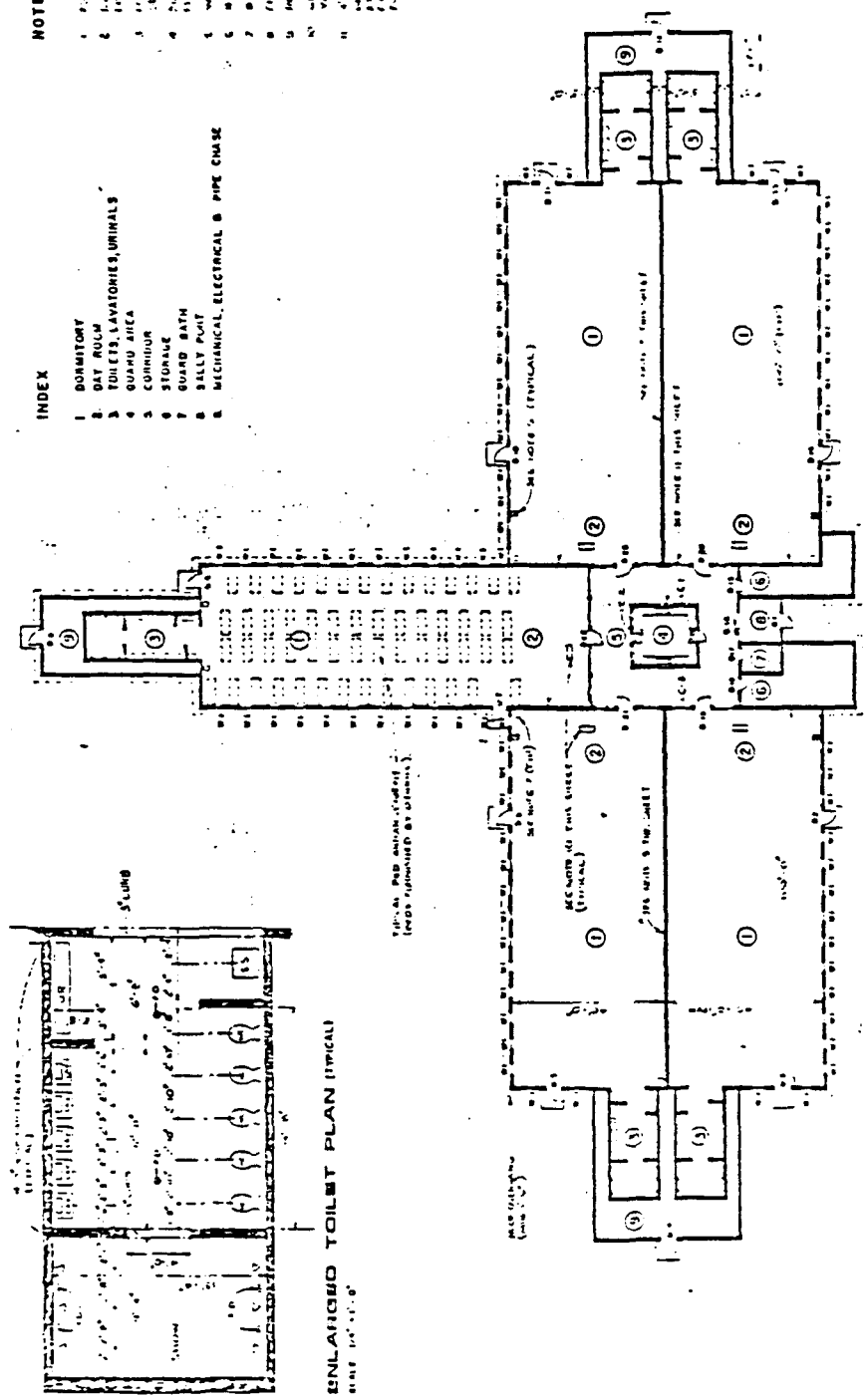

WASHINGTON CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTE

I. Maximum Inmate Population

1.1 Maximum Present Inmate Population

The DOC agrees and stipulates that no more than 1120 inmates will be housed in the housing areas at Washington Correctional Institute (Washington). The DOC further agrees and stipulates that no more than 1120 inmates shall be housed in the housing areas of Washington at any time during the term or any extensions of the Stipulation and Consent Decree which became effective as of November 1, 1983 (the "Decree"). The DOC shall not be authorized to house inmates in the existing housing areas unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II, below, are maintained. As of November 1, 1983, only dormitories K-1, K-2, K-3, K-4, L-1, L-2, L-3, L-4, M-1 and M-2 are being utilized. Some of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Exhibit G apply only to restrict the housing of inmates in specified housing areas. Except where specifically limited in this manner, however, the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Exhibit G must be maintained in order to house any inmates in Washington.

- 1.2 The DOC anticipates no increase in the maximum inmate population beyond 1120 inmates at Washington during the term or any extension of the Decree.

II. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Present Inmate Population

- 2.1 DOC's right to house 1120 inmates in the housing areas at Washington during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part II.

2.2 Distribution

The inmates housed at Washington shall be distributed in dormitories as indicated below.

2.3 Cellblocks M-3, M-4, M-5 and M-6

Cellblocks M-3 and M-4 have been constructed in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit G-2, and these cellblocks are now available for use. Cellblocks M-5 and M-6 shall be fully constructed in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit G-2 no later than August 1, 1983.

Inmates shall be housed in Cellblocks M-3, M-4, M-5 and M-6 only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any thirty day period.

The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in Cellblocks M-3 and M-4 shall be 104, distributed as follows:

Cellblock M-3	52
Cellblock M-4	52

If deemed necessary by the warden, up to two inmates may be housed in each cell of Cellblocks M-3 and M-4 on a temporary basis until August 1, 1984 or until Cellblocks M-5 and M-6 are constructed and available for use, whichever occurs first. However, at no time shall an inmate be housed in a cell with another inmate for more than 15 days in any 30 day period.

No more than one inmate shall be housed in each cell of Cellblocks M-5 and M-6. The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in Cellblocks M-5 and M-6 shall be 48, distributed as follows:

Cellblock M-5	24
Cellblock M-6	24

2.4 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for housing areas and cellblocks as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit G-1; provided, however, that security assignments need not be maintained for housing areas or cellblocks which are not being used.
- b. The purposes of the Decree may be satisfied by deployment of security guards in the housing areas and cellblocks in the manner

designated on the site plans for Washington which have been submitted to this Court as part of a separate Exhibit L. However, the warden may redeploy security guards within any housing area, provided that:

- (i) there is no reduction in the total number of security guards within any housing area, and
 - (ii) the redeployment will more effectively assure prison safety and efficiency.
- c. In addition to the security guards assigned to housing areas and cell-blocks as indicated above, a minimum of 172 additional security guards shall ultimately be assigned to other areas of Washington, assigned as "roving" security guards, assigned to transport duty or utilized as relief guards for the living areas. The DOC need not maintain assignment of all 172 additional guards in the event that only some of the new living areas are utilized, provided that enough additional security guards are assigned to assure prison safety. At any given time, no more than two of these additional security guards shall be assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

2.5 Health and Medical Personnel

- a. The following health and medical personnel shall be employed on a full time basis:

- 1 Physician IV
- 1 Registered Nurse III
- 3 Registered Nurses II
- 1 Practical Nurse III
- 2 Practical Nurses II
- 1 Medical Records Technician
- 1 Radiology Technician III

The following additional health and medical personnel shall be employed on a full time basis no later than September 30, 1984:

- 1 Pharmacist (in lieu of contract services of Pharmacist, below)
- 1 Physician III (in lieu of contract services of Physician on call, below)
- 1 Registered Nurse II (for a total of 4 Registered Nurses II)
- 1 Practical Nurse II (for a total of 3 Practical Nurse II)
- 1 Laboratory Technician

b. The following medical services shall be retained on a contract basis:

Dentist (8 hours/week)
Pharmacist (10 hours/week)
Physician (on call)
Optometrist (2 hours/week)
Radiologist (4 hours/week)

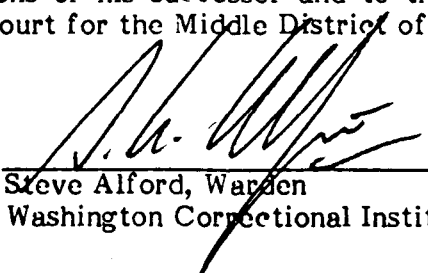
The following additional medical services shall be retained on a contract basis no later than September 30, 1984.

Dentist (4 hours/week, for a total of 12 hours/week)
Optometrist (2 hours/week, for a total of 4 hours/week)

c. In the event that health or medical personnel or services are terminated as a result of retirement, resignation or otherwise, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall initiate the procedure for filling the vacated position or contracting for the lost services. The warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall obtain replacement health and medical contract services on a temporary basis until the services are again under contract. If a health or medical position (whether personnel or contract services) does not remain vacant for more than 30 days, then, notwithstanding any provision of the Decree or this Exhibit, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall have no obligation to report such vacancy or obtain court authority for such vacancy.

III. Acknowledgment and Certification

I, Steve Alford, warden of Washington Correctional Institute, acknowledge that I have carefully read the Stipulation and Consent Decree and this Exhibit G. I certify that the information set forth in Exhibit G is, to the best of my knowledge, true and correct and accurately reflects existing conditions at Washington Correctional Institute. I further certify that if I become aware of a more effective method to accomplish the purposes of the Stipulation and Consent Decree, I will submit a written request for modification to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor. I further certify that if I become aware of any conditions at Washington Correctional Institute which violate the Stipulation and Consent Decree or any amendment thereto, or any conditions which would constitute cruel and unusual punishment, then I will immediately report such conditions to the Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his successor and to the Honorable Frank Polozola, Judge, United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana.

1.1 Maximum Present Inmate Population

The Department of Corrections ("DOC") agrees and stipulates that no more than 550 inmates are housed in existing housing areas at Work Training Facility-North (Camp Beauregard) as of November 1, 1983. For purposes of this Exhibit H, the Woodworth Forestry Center shall be included as part of Camp Beauregard as North Dorm and South Dorm. The DOC further agrees and stipulates that no more than 550 inmates shall be housed in the existing housing areas of Camp Beauregard at any time during the term or any extensions of the Stipulation and Consent Decree which became effective as of November 1, 1983 (the "Decree"). The DOC shall not be authorized to house inmates in the existing housing areas unless the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in Part II, below, are maintained.

1.2 Maximum Increase in Populations

The DOC anticipates no increase in the maximum number of inmates housed at Camp Beauregard during the term or any extension of the Decree.

II. Conditions, Limitations and Standards for Present Inmate Population

2.1 DOC's right to house 550 inmates in existing housing areas at Camp Beauregard during the term or any extension of the Decree is contingent on the existence and maintenance of the conditions, limitations and standards set forth in this Part II.

2.2 Distribution

The inmates housed at Camp Beauregard shall be distributed in dormitories as indicated below.

2.3 Existing Cellblock-Units 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7

Inmates shall be housed in Units 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any thirty day period.

No more than one inmate shall be housed in each cell of Units 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7. The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in Units 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 from the effective date of the Decree shall be five.

2.4 Security Assignments

- a. Security assignments shall be maintained for the housing areas and cellblocks as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit H-1.
- b. The purposes of the Decree may be satisfied by deployment of security guards in the housing areas and cellblocks in the manner designated on the site plans for Camp Beauregard which have been submitted to this Court as part of a separate Exhibit L. However, the warden may redeploy security guards within any housing area, provided that:
 - (i) there is no reduction in the total number of security guards within any housing area, and
 - (ii) the redeployment will more effectively assure prison safety and efficiency.
- c. In addition to the security guards assigned to housing areas and cellblocks as indicated above, a minimum of 42 additional security guards shall be assigned to other areas of Camp Beauregard, assigned as "roving" security guards, assigned to transport duty, or utilized as relief guards for the living areas. At any given time, no more than two of these additional security guards shall be assigned primarily to non-security functions. These additional security guards shall be deployed in a manner which the warden deems most effective to assure prison safety and efficiency.

2.5 New Cellblock

New cells shall be constructed and available for use not later than April 30, 1984 in accordance with the schematic diagram attached as Exhibit H-2.

Inmates shall be housed in new cellblocks only for the following reasons: (1) disciplinary, (2) awaiting transfer, (3) awaiting trial or disciplinary board hearing, (4) adjustment or (5) protective custody. No inmate shall be held in disciplinary isolation for more than two 10 day periods during any thirty day period.

No more than three inmates shall be housed in each of the four cells of the new cellblock. The maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in new cellblock from the effective date of the Decree shall be 12. No inmate shall be housed in an individual cell with another inmate (or other inmates) for more than 20 days in any 30 day period.

2.6 Health and Medical Personnel

- a. The following health and medical personnel shall be employed on a full time basis:

2 Registered Nurses II
3 Medical Specialist II
1 Practical Nurse III

- b. The following medical services shall be retained on a contract basis:

Physician (15 hours/week)
Dentist (12 hours/week)
Pharmacist (10 hours/week)
Optometrist (18 exams/month)

- c. In the event that health or medical personnel or services are terminated as a result of retirement, resignation or otherwise, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall initiate the procedure for filling the vacated position or contracting for the lost services. The warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall obtain replacement health and medical contract services on a temporary basis until the services are again under contract. If a health or medical position (whether personnel or contract services) does not remain vacant for more than 30 days, then, notwithstanding any provision of the Decree or this Exhibit, the warden or the Secretary of the DOC shall have no obligation to report such vacancy or obtain court authority for such vacancy.
