MOTION AND ORDER TO CLARIFY CONSENT DECREE

On motion of the Eunice Police Department for the City of Eunice, through undersigned counsel, and upon showing the Court that the consent decree previously entered into in the above numbered and captioned matter inadvertently omitted the designation of "Cell 7 and Cell 8," thereby incorrectly stating that the Eunice City Jail had six (6) male cells plus two (2) female cells, and should be clarified by court order reflecting that it actually contains eight (8) male cells and two (2) female cells. Mover attaches hereto the following exhibits in support of this motion, to-wit: (1) copy of the Maximum Population report dated January 7, 1983 and the accompanying Order dated January 10, 1983; (2) a copy of the Memorandum dated November 1, 1996, from Linda Ramsey, Executive Officer in the Department of Public Safety; (3) a copy of the Memorandum dated November 4, 1996 from Venetia T. Michael, Basic Jail Guidelines Coordinator; and (4) Affidavit executed by Police Chief Charles Manuel, dated November 27, 1996.

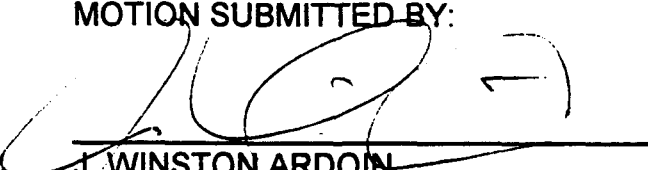
