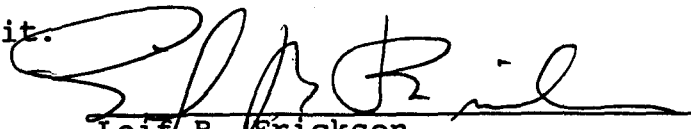

This matter now before the Court on the parties' Joint Motion to Approve Stipulation Regarding Medical Care, it is hereby ORDERED that the said Stipulation is approved and entered as an Order of the Court. It is FURTHER ORDERED that the defendants shall post copies of the annexed Notice to Members of the Plaintiffs Class of Stipulation Regarding Medical Care in each housing area at Montana State Prison (MSP) and the Warm Springs Expansion Unit, provide a separate copy of the Notice to each prisoner housed in the Maximum Security Unit at MSP, and deposit copies of the Joint Stipulation and Settlement Agreement in the High and Low Side libraries for review by the plaintiff class at MSP.
