STIPULATION AND CONSENT DECREE

IT IS HEREBY AGREED AND STIPULATED that the maximum number of inmates which shall be housed in the new St. Landry Parish Jail shall be as follows:

FIRST FLOOR:

1. Medical exam and hold cell - one inmate;
2. Five double bunk holding cells - two inmates per cell with stay not to exceed seventy-two (72) hours, or one full time inmate per cell;
3. Padded cell - one inmate;
4. Detoxification Cell - three inmates with stay not to exceed twenty-four (24) hours;
5. Group Holding cell - Ten inmates with stay not to exceed seventy-two (72) hours; or six full time inmates;

SECOND FLOOR:

1. Cell Block 2A containing twelve cells - one inmate per cell;
2. Cell Block 2B containing nine cells - one inmate per cell;
3. Cell Block 2C, Trustee Dormitory - sixteen inmates;
4. Cell Block 2D containing thirteen cells - one inmate per cell;
5. One single bunk clinic - one inmate.

THIRD FLOOR:

1. Cell Block 3A, containing thirteen cells - one inmate per cell;
2. Cell Block 3B, containing thirteen cells - one inmate per cell;
3. Cell Block 3C, containing thirteen cells - one inmate per cell;
4. Cell Block 3D, containing thirteen cells- one inmate per cell;

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that the staffing requirements for the new St. Landry Parish Jail shall be as follows:

1. Two guards on first floor, with radio dispatcher to be considered as one of the guards, and the other guard to be subject to immediate movement to the other floors as needed in emergency situations;

2. One guard on duty on second floor, with constant communication being maintained with first floor;
3. One guard on duty on third floor, with constant communication being maintained with first floor.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that the parish may not house any inmate in a parish or city jail whose population limits have not been approved by the Court.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that the State Fire Marshall and State Health Officer shall have the right to proceed in the appropriate state court to enforce the rules and regulations of their respective officers.
