The United States of America alleges:

1. This action is brought by the Attorney General in the name and on behalf of the United States of America under 42 U.S.C. 1971 as amended by the Civil Rights Acts of 1957, 1960, and 1964. It seeks to enjoin the use in the State of Alabama of voter registration tests which violate the Constitution and laws of the United States.

2. This Court has jurisdiction of this action under 42 U.S.C. 1971(d), (n), 28 U.S.C. 1345 and 28 U.S.C. 2281.

3. The defendant State of Alabama through its officials and agents prescribes and administers the voter registration tests and requirements in Alabama. The principal State offices and the capital of the State are in Montgomery.

4. Agnes Baggett is the Secretary of State for the State of Alabama. In this capacity she provides to the registrars of voters of each county the forms of applications and tests to be administered in the registration of voters. She also receives reports periodically from each county regarding the registration of voters. Her office is located and she resides in Montgomery, Alabama.

5. In Alabama, registration is a prerequisite to voting in any election. Registration is permanent and in the absence of special legislation, voters are not required to reregister except when they move from one county to another.

6. Prior to November 14, 1946, the Constitution of Alabama of 1901 provided by section 181 that after January 1, 1903 persons otherwise qualified shall be qualified to register as electors if they are able to read and write any article of the Constitution of the United States or if they own 40 acres of land in Alabama, or own real or personal property in Alabama assessed for taxation at the value of \$300 or more. ^{III} Literacy was not a disqualification if the applicant for registration could meet the property qualifications. On

November 14, 1946 the voters of Alabama adopted amendment LV, commonly known as the "Boswell amendment."

The property qualification alternative was abandoned and all persons seeking thereafter to register to vote were required to be able to read, write, understand and explain any article of the Constitution of the United States. After the Boswell amendment was declared unconstitutional, the voters of Alabama on December 19, 1951 adopted amendment XCI. Under section 181 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, Amendment XCI, citizens over the age of twenty-one years who possess the qualifications as to residence prescribed in section 178 are qualified to register as electors provided they are not disqualified under section 182, if they can read and write any article of the Constitution of the United States and if they are of good character and embrace the duties and obligations of citizenship under the Constitution of the United States and under the Constitution of Alabama. In order to aid the county registrars in determining whether applicants for registration possess the above qualifications, each applicant is to answer in writing without assistance a questionnaire prescribed by the Supreme Court of Alabama. This portion of the Constitution of Alabama has not since been further amended.

7. During the period from about January 1952 to about February 1964 the county registrars in Alabama used a four-page application form and questionnaire in the registration of voters. This form and questionnaire

was prescribed by the Supreme Court of Alabama. A copy of this application form and questionnaire is attached hereto as Attachment A and is incorporated herein.

8. During the period referred to in paragraph 7 applicants for registration to vote in Alabama, except in two counties, rarely were required to demonstrate their ability to read or write any article of the Constitution. White applicants were not required to complete the application form and questionnaire without error or omission and they were not required to fill out the application form and questionnaire without assistance. During the same period numerous Negro applicants for registration to vote in Alabama were denied registration on the ground that they made errors and/or omissions in completing the application form and questionnaire. They were denied assistance in filling out the application form and questionnaire. **Negroes in the State of Alabama have been deprived of their right to vote without distinction of race pursuant to a pattern and practice of racial discrimination.**

9. In the State of Alabama there are approximately 1,353,058 white persons and 421,320 Negroes of voting age. Of these, approximately 935,695 white persons (or about 69%) and about 93,737 Negroes (or about 19%) are registered to vote. In each of the 67 counties of Alabama more than 50% of the adult white persons are registered to vote. In at least 40 of these counties less than 25% of the adult Negroes are registered to vote. The approximate number of white and Negro persons of voting

age and the approximate number of white and Negro persons registered to vote in each county of Alabama are set forth in Attachment B and are incorporated herein.

10. On January 14, 1964, the Supreme Court of Alabama prescribed a new and different application form and questionnaire to be used by the boards of registrars throughout the State. This new application form and questionnaire included a page labeled "Insert Part III", which contained tests to be used as part of the questionnaire. These tests contained four questions testing the applicant's knowledge of government; four excerpts from the United States Constitution one or more of which were to be read aloud by the applicant to the registrar; and a space for the applicant to write from the dictation of a registrar several words from the Constitution. The Supreme Court's order provided for twelve of these inserts -- a different one to be used each month. A total of twenty-four different questions on government and nineteen provisions of the Constitution appeared on the twelve Part III Inserts. A copy of the new application form including one of the Insert Part III tests is set forth in Attachment C and is incorporated herein.

11. In February, 1964, the county registrars in Alabama began to require applicants for registration to take the Insert Part III tests. Numerous applicants have been denied registration on the ground that their performance on these tests was unsatisfactory. The Insert Part III tests as a procedure and standard for testing

the literacy of applicants are different from and more stringent than any testing procedures or standards previously applied to individuals who have been found by Alabama registrars of voters to be qualified to vote.

12. On August 26, 1964, the Supreme Court of Alabama ordered the county boards of registrars throughout Alabama to use a revised form of Insert Part III. According to this order, this revision was necessary because of the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. The revised Insert Part III contains different tests from those which had previously been used. These tests consist of eight questions; four testing the applicant's knowledge of government; four testing the applicant's comprehension and reasoning ability based on printed excerpts from the United States Constitution; and a dictation test administered by the registrar from one or more of the excerpts of the United States Constitution. There are 100 different forms of these tests. A total of 399 different questions on government and 139 different excerpts from substantially all of the Constitution are used in making up these tests. A copy of the 100 different forms of these tests is attached as Attachment D and is incorporated herein.

13. In September 1964, the county registrars in Alabama began to require applicants for registration to take the revised Insert Part III tests. Numerous applicants have been denied registration on the ground that their performance on these tests was unsatisfactory. The testing procedures and standards established by the revised Insert Part III are different from and more stringent than any testing procedures and standards previously applied to individuals who have been found by Alabama registrars of voters to be qualified to vote.

14. The successful performance by applicants in taking the Insert Part III tests described in paragraphs 10 and 12 is directly related to the educational achievements of the applicants. Applicants who have enjoyed superior educational opportunities and attainments are better able to become qualified voters in Alabama than are those with inferior educational opportunities and attainments.

15. The State of Alabama has since at least 1900 provided a program of public education for its residents. During this period Alabama has maintained separate public schools for Negro and white students. Since 1963,

pursuant to federal court orders, eight of Alabama's 118 bi-racial school districts have been desegregated. At the present time, about 294,000 Negro children are enrolled in Alabama public schools, 94 of whom are enrolled in desegregated public schools.

16. Since at least 1900 the public educational facilities and opportunities provided for Negroes in Alabama have been vastly inferior to those provided for white persons. The pupil-teacher ratio was consistently lower in white schools; the length of school terms was longer in white schools; expenditures per pupil were higher in white schools; average teachers' salaries were higher in white schools; and the qualifications and training required of teachers employed in white schools has been superior to the qualifications and training of teachers employed in Negro schools.

17. Numerous Negro applicants for registration to vote who were of school age and eligible for public education in Alabama when the public educational opportunities provided for Negroes were inferior to those provided for white persons have been denied registration to vote on the ground that they did not satisfactorily pass the test provided for under the original and revised versions of Insert Part III of the application form and questionnaire.

18. Successful performance by applicants for registration on the tests provided for under the original and revised versions of Insert Part III of the application form and questionnaire requires a comprehension and literacy level higher than that normally attained by the completion of six grades of formal public education. The use of the Insert Part III tests in Alabama thus nullifies

the sixth grade presumption of literacy established by the Congress of the United States by Title I of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; and such use of these tests violates Article VI of the Constitution of the United States.

19. The use in Alabama of the Insert Part III tests promulgated in January 1964 and the revised Insert Part III tests promulgated in August 1964 as prerequisites to voting violates 42 U.S.C. 1971(a) and the Fifteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States for the following reasons:

- (a) It imposes testing procedures and standards which are different from and more stringent than any testing procedures or standards which have been applied to other individuals who have been found by Alabama registrars to be qualified to vote in Alabama, in violation of 42 U.S.C. 1971(a)(2)(A).
- (b) It nullifies the sixth grade presumption of literacy established by Congress in 42 U.S.C. 1971(c) by requiring a comprehension and literacy level higher than is normally attained by the completion of six grades of education, in violation of Article VI of the Constitution of the United States.
- (c) It imposes an oral dictation test in violation of 42 U.S.C. 1971(a)(2)(C).

- (d) It discriminates against Negro applicants and in favor of white applicants because of distinctions in the quality of educational opportunities resulting from a segregated public school system in Alabama, in violation of the Fifteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.
- (e) It freezes the existing racial imbalance of the voting structure in Alabama by imposing new and more stringent registration requirements and standards upon future applicants following a long period of discrimination against Negroes in the registration of voters in Alabama, in violation of the Fifteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.
- (f) It imposes arbitrarily difficult voter registration requirements and standards at a time when less than 20% of the adult Negroes and more than 65% of the adult white persons in Alabama are registered to vote in a state where there has been a long standing policy of racial segregation and discrimination.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays that,

Pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. 2281, and 42 U.S.C. 1971(h), a District Court of three judges be convened in accordance with the procedures set forth in 28 U.S.C. 2284 and 42 U.S.C. 1971(h) and that said Court issue a preliminary and permanent injunction enjoining the defendants, their agents, employees, their successors, and all persons in active concert and participation with them from:

1. In determining whether any individual is qualified to vote in any Federal election, applying any testing procedures or standards which are different from and more stringent than any which have been applied to other individuals who have previously been found by state officials or agents to be qualified to vote in Alabama.

2. Using either the original or the revised Insert Part III tests in determining whether applicants for registration are qualified to register to vote.

3. Using any literacy test as a prerequisite to voting in federal elections which requires a performance level higher than that normally obtained by the completion of six grades of education .

4. Using any literacy test as a prerequisite to voting in federal elections which is not wholly in writing.

5. Requiring any Negro applicant for registration to vote in Alabama who was of school age and eligible for public education at a time when the public schools were segregated according to race, to take or complete

any voter qualification test the successful performance of which is directly related to the educational achievement of the applicant.

6. Engaging in any act which would deprive any citizen in the State of Alabama of the right to register and the right to vote without distinction of race or color.

Plaintiff further prays that this Court order the defendants and their agents to take whatever steps are necessary to place upon the current voter registration rolls of their respective counties the names of all applicants for registration to vote who have been denied registration on the ground that they have failed the tests provided for in the original and revised Insert Part III.

Plaintiff further prays that this Court make a finding that Negro citizens in Alabama have been deprived of the right to vote without distinction of race pursuant to a pattern and practice of discrimination.

Plaintiff further prays that this Court instruct Defendant Agnes Baggett to advise each of the County registrars of voters in Alabama to cease using either the original or the revised Insert Part III tests in any manner or for any purpose in the voter registration process.

Plaintiff further prays that this Court grant
such additional relief as justice may require together
with the costs and disbursements of this action.

Part 3. Each house may determine the rules of its proceedings, punish its members for disorderly behavior, and, with the concurrence of two-thirds, expel a member.

Part 4. The transportation or importation into any State, Territory, or possession of the United States for delivery or use therein of intoxicating liquors, in violation of the laws thereof, is hereby prohibited.

EXCERPTS FROM THE CONSTITUTION

Every bill which shall have passed the house of representatives and the senate, shall, before it become a law, be presented to the president of the United States; if he approve he shall sign it, but if not he shall return it, with his objections to that house in which it shall have originated, who shall enter the objections at large on their journal, and proceed to reconsider it. If after such reconsideration two-thirds of that house shall agree to pass the bill, it shall be sent, together with the objections, to the other house, by which it shall likewise be reconsidered, and if approved by two-thirds of that house, it shall become a law.

Part 2. The house of representatives shall choose their speaker and other officers; and shall have the sole power of impeachment.

The congress, whenever two-thirds of both houses shall deem it necessary, shall propose amendments to this constitution, or on the application of the legislatures of two-thirds of the several states, shall call a convention for proposing amendments, which, in either case, shall be valid to all intents and purposes, as part of this constitution, when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states, or by conventions in three-fourths thereof, as the one or the other mode of ratification may be proposed by the congress; Provided that no amendment which may be made prior to the year one thousand eight hundred and eight shall in any manner affect the first and fourth clauses in the ninth section of the first article; and that no state, without its consent, shall be deprived of its equal suffrage in the senate.

Part 2. In suits at common law, where the value in controversy shall exceed twenty dollars, the right of trial by jury shall be preserved, and no fact tried by a jury shall be otherwise re-examined in any court of the United States, than according to the rules of the common law.

Part 3. Excessive bail shall not be required, nor excessive fines imposed, nor cruel and unusual punishments inflicted.

Part 4. No title of nobility shall be granted by the United States; and no person holding any office of profit or trust under them, shall, without the consent of the congress, accept of any present, emolument, office, or title, of any kind whatever, from any king, prince, or foreign state.

The seats of the senators of the first class shall be vacated at the expiration of the second year, of the second class at the expiration of the fourth year, and of the third class at the expiration of the sixth year, so that one-third may be chosen every second year.

Every order, resolution, or vote to which the concurrence of the senate and house of representatives may be necessary (except on a question of adjournment) shall be presented to the president of the United States; and before the same shall take effect, shall be approved by him, or being disapproved by him, shall be repassed by two-thirds of the senate and house of representatives, according to the rules and limitations prescribed in the case of a bill.

Part 2. The Congress may by law provide for the case of the death of any of the persons from whom the House of Representatives may choose a President whenever the right of choice shall have devolved upon them, and for the case of the death of any of the persons from whom the Senate may choose a Vice President whenever the right of choice shall have devolved upon them.

Part 3. No person shall be elected to the office of the president more than twice, and no person who has held the office of president, or acted as president, for more than two years of a term to which some other person was elected president shall be elected to the office of the president more than once.

The seats of the senators of the first class shall be vacated at the expiration of the second year, of the second class at the expiration of the fourth year, and of the third class at the expiration of the sixth year, so that one-third may be chosen every second year.

EXCERPTS FROM THE CONSTITUTION

Part 1. He (the president) shall from time to time give to the congress information of the state of the Union, and recommend to their consideration such measures as he shall judge necessary and expedient; he may, on extraordinary occasions, convene both houses, or either of them, and in case of disagreement between them, with respect to the time of adjournment, he may adjourn them to such time as he shall think proper; he shall receive ambassadors and other public ministers; he shall take care that the laws be faithfully executed, and shall commission all the officers of the United States.

Part 2. The congress shall have power to lay and collect taxes on incomes, from whatever source derived, without apportionment among the several states, and without regard to any census or enumeration.

Part 3. Full faith and credit shall be given in each state to the public acts, records, and judicial proceedings of every other state. And the congress may by general laws prescribe the manner in which such acts, records and proceedings shall be proved, and the effect thereof.

Part 4. A person charged in any state with treason, felony, or other crime, who shall flee from justice, and be found in another state, shall on demand of the executive authority of the state from which he fled, be delivered up, to be removed to the state having jurisdiction of the crime.

EXCERPTS FROM THE CONSTITUTION

Part 1. No person shall be a senator or representative in congress, or elector of president and vice-president, or hold any office, civil or military, under the United States, or under any state, who, having previously taken an oath, as a member of congress, or as an officer of the United States, or as a member of any state legislature, or as an executive or judicial officer of any state, to support the constitution of the United States, shall have engaged in insurrection or rebellion against the same, or given aid or comfort to the enemies thereof. But congress may, by a vote of two-thirds of each house, remove such disability.

Part 2. New states may be admitted by the congress into this Union; but no new states shall be formed or erected within the jurisdiction of any other state; nor any state be formed by the junction of two or more states, or parts of states, without the consent of the legislatures of the states concerned as well as of the congress.

Part 3. The congress shall have power to dispose of and make all needful rules and regulations respecting the territory or other property belonging to the United States; and nothing in this constitution shall be so construed as to prejudice any claims of the United States, or of any particular state.

Part 4. The congress shall have power:

To provide for the punishment of counterfeiting the securities and current coin of the United States.

EXCERPTS FROM THE CONSTITUTION

Part 1. The electors shall meet in their respective states, and vote by ballot for president and vice-president, one of whom, at least, shall not be an inhabitant of the same state with themselves; they shall name in their ballots the person voted for as president, and in distinct ballots the person voted for as vice-president, and they shall make distinct lists of all persons voted for as president, and of all persons voted for as vice-president, and of the number of votes for each, which lists they shall sign and certify, and transmit sealed to the seat of the government of the United States, directed to the president of the senate.

Part 2. The powers not delegated to the United States by the constitution, nor prohibited by it to the states, are reserved to the states respectively, or to the people.

Part 3. The judicial power of the United States shall not be construed to extend to any suit in law or equity, commenced or prosecuted against one of the United States by citizens of another state, or by citizens or subjects of any foreign state.

Part 4. The congress shall have power:

To declare war, grant letters of marque and reprisal, and make rules concerning captures on land and water.

EXCERPTS FROM THE CONSTITUTION

Part 1. The senators and representatives before mentioned, and the members of the several state legislatures, and all executive and judicial officers, both of the United States and of the several states, shall be bound by oath or affirmation, to support this constitution; but no religious tests shall ever be required as a qualification to any office or public trust under the United States.

Part 2. The house of representatives shall be composed of members chosen every second year by the people of the several states, and the electors in each state shall have the qualifications requisite for electors of the most numerous branch of the state legislature.

Part 3. No person shall be a representative who shall not have attained to the age of twenty-five years, and been seven years a citizen of the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be an inhabitant of that state in which he shall be chosen.

Part 4. The ratification of the conventions of nine states, shall be sufficient for the establishment of this constitution between the states so ratifying the same.
