POLICE CADET

VARIOUS POLICE DEPARTMENTS, NASSAU COUNTY

SALARY: In Nassau County: Starting salary: \$5,659. Maximum in three years: \$6,502. Varies in other jurisdictions.

DUTIES: Under immediate supervision, as office or precinct aide, performs a variety of routine non-enforcement tasks. Participates in on-the-job training.

VACANCIES: The eligible list established as a result of this examination will be used to fill current and anticipated vacancies as they occur in the various police departments in Nassau County.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must meet the following requirements:

AGE: Candidates must be not less than 17 years of age and must not have reached their 20th birthday on or before March 18, 1972. Eligibility for appointment will terminate when a candidate reaches his 21st birthday.

EDUCATION: Candidates must be graduates of a senior high school or must be in their senior year on the last date for filing. Proof of graduation must be submitted by August 1, 1972. All persons appointed to the position of Police Cadet must attend college on a part-time basis during their period of employment as a Cadet.

A Cadet appointed as a result of a Civil Service examination may be appointed as a Patrolman after reaching his 21st birthday provided he has acquired a total of 34 college credits prior to his 22nd birthday, has a satisfactory record as a Cadet for six months and passes the pre-appointment medical given to Patrolman candidates, and meets all other requirements for Patrolman. A Cadet's eligibility for appointment as a Patrolman will expire upon reaching his twenty-second (22) birthday.

RESIDENCE: Candidates must have been legal residents of Nassau County and/or a contiguous county for at least twelve months immediately preceding the date of the written test. Preference in appointment may be given to successful candidates who have been legal residents of the appointing jurisdiction for at least twelve months immediately preceding the date of the written test.

MEDICAL AND PHYSICAL: Please refer to attached sheets PD-2 and PD-3.

SUBJECT OF EXAMINATION: WRITTEN TEST - relative weight 100; Medical test and Strength and Agility test, qualifying only. Written test designed to reveal the aptitude, intelligence, initiative, reasoning ability, common sense and judgment of the candidate; his ability to understand and carry out directions and to make clear, accurate reports of investigations and accidents; and general knowledge.

CANDIDATES WHO ARE NOT SUCCESSFUL IN ANY PART OF THIS EXAMINATION WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR FURTHER EXAMINATION. THE MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS MUST BE MET AT THE TIME OF THE CIVIL SERVICE MEDICAL AND AT THE TIME OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT'S PRE-APPOINTMENT MEDICAL.

CONVICTION OF A FELONY WILL BAR AND OF A MISDEMEANOR MAY BAR EXAMINATION AND APPOINTMENT.

The Nassau County Civil Service Commission reserves the right to reject for lateness or to accept applications filed after the advertised filing period.

POLICE PATROLMAN

VARIOUS POLICE DEPARTMENTS, NASSAU COUNTY

SALARIES: Salary range for the Nassau County Police Department: \$9,514.-\$12,808. Includes holiday pay. (Salary increase anticipated.) Varies for other jurisdictions.

VACANCIES: The eligible list established as a result of this examination will be used to fill current and anticipated vacancies as they occur in the various police departments in Nassau County.

DUTIES: Under direct supervision, has responsibility for the protection of lives and property and the enforcement of laws and ordinances in as assigned district during a specific period.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must meet the following requirements:
RESIDENCE: Candidates must have been legal residents of Nassau County and/or a contiguous county for at least twelve months immediately preceding the date of the written test. Preference in appointment may be given to successful candidates who have been legal residents of the appointing jurisdiction for at least twelve months immediately preceding the date of the written test.

AGE: Candidates must be not less than 20 years of age and must not have reached their 29th birthday on the date of the written test. Eligibility for appointment will not begin until a candidate has reached his 21st birthday. Eligibility for appointment for candidates who become 29 years of age after the date of the written test will remain in effect for the duration of the list. (Note effect of military duty on age limits - Section of the Civil Service Law and Section 243 of the Military Law).

EDUCATION: Candidates must be graduates of a senior high school or must possess a High School Equivalency Diploma. G.E.D.'s are acceptable (High School Level). Candidates for the following Police Departments must have attained 32 college credits before their names can be certified for appointment: Nassau County, Great Neck Estates, Kings Point, Old Brookville, Sands Point. For the seventeen remaining Village Police Departments, a High School graduation is required for appointment.

MEDICAL AND PHYSICAL: Please refer to attached sheets PD-2 - PD-3.

LICENSE: A valid, unrestricted New York State Operator's or Chauffeur's License will be required at the time of certification from the eligible list.

SUBJECT OF EXAMINATION: WRITTEN TEST - relative weight 100: Medical test and Strength Agility test, qualifying only. Written test designed to reveal the aptitude, intelligence, initiative, reasoning ability, common sense and judgment of the candidate; his ability to understand and carry out directions and to make clear, accurate reports of investigation and accidents, and general knowledge.

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
