This table contains a detailed chronology of events in Dallas County from July 4, 1964, through July 9, 1964. Each entry is supported by evidence as indicated in parentheses.

July 4

12:00 noon William Suther of the mounted posse was called to duty. (Testimony of Suther)

12:33 p.m. City Police car No. 22 reported: "about 12 Negroes by Wilby." (Pl. Ex. 13C)

12:54 p.m. County Sheriff's car No. D-5 was instructed to go to the Wilby Theater. A few minutes later, D-5 stopped at the Wilby. (Pl.Ex. 29G)

1:00 p.m. William Suther arrived at the Wilby Theater in a county car. He stayed at the theater for one or two hours. Other members of the posse were also at the theater. (Testimony of Suther)

1:45 p.m. Dorothy Oliver, a cashier at the Wilby Theater, opened the theater about 1:45. There was a large crowd of Negroes and white persons outside, including more Negroes than whites. The crowd had formed orderly lines at the Negro and white ticket windows. The second balcony, which had previously been the Negro section, filled about an hour after the opening of the theater. After that, most of the persons waiting were Negro youngsters. No Negroes tried to buy tickets for the white section until later in the afternoon. (Testimony of Butler and Oliver).

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2:03 p.m.

A State Trooper radio call reported that units 572 (Head) and DL (Clark) were at the courthouse. (Pl. Ex. 31C; see Table I.)

3:00-3:30 p.m.

James Wiley, Carol Lawson, Silas Norman, and Karen House, all Negroes, drove into the parking lot of the Thirsty Boy Drive-In to have lunch. When they got out of their car, John Warren, the operator of the drive-in, met the group in the parking lot and told them, "You might as well go away, this is private property." The group drove away, and Warren called the Sheriff and asked him to come. (Testimony of Wiley, House, Lawson, Norman, and Warren).

3:16 p.m.

County Sheriff's car D-5 was dispatched to the Thirsty Boy. (Pl. Ex. 29G)

3:17

County car D-1 (Sheriff Clark) was dispatched to the Thirsty Boy. (Pl. Ex. 29G)

3:00-3:30p.m.
(cont'd)

Meanwhile, the group of four Negroes parked their car on Broad Street and walked across Broad Street and into the Thirsty Boy. They took seats at a table in the middle of the dining area. There were several persons present, but no one said anything to the group of Negroes. Wiley noticed a self-service sign and told Norman that they had to order. Norman went to the counter by the large service window. A waitress went into

JUL 4 : the back room. Warren was behind the service window. He asked the Negroes to leave, in a low voice and mostly by motion. Wiley did not hear Warren tell the Negroes to leave. (Testimony of Wiley and Warren) Deputy Sheriff Hewston arrived at the Thirsty Boy shortly after 3:16, and Sheriff Clark arrived a few minutes later with State Investigator Head. Deputy Hewston, Deputy Bates, and Sheriff Clark went inside the Thirsty Boy.^{1/} Warren told Hewston that there were people there he would like to remove. Hewston told Warren that he would have to sign warrants. Sheriff Clark went to the small window through which trays are passed and said to Warren, "You want them all arrested, don't you?" Warren replied, "No, I just want them out of here." The Sheriff repeated his question, after which Warren was given the warrants, which he signed.^{2/} The warrants which were used had

^{1/} Clark testified that Hewston was already there when he arrived with Head in the car. Most probably Hewston arrived in car D-5, which was dispatched to the Thirsty Boy at 3:16 p.m. and Clark arrived in car D-1, which was dispatched at 3:17 p.m. Hewston testified that Clark was "with" him, which probably meant that Clark went inside the restaurant with him or closely behind him, not that Clark arrived in the same car with him.

^{2/} Clark testified that Warren was already signing the papers when he arrived. But Wiley testified that he thought Clark asked Warren twice whether Warren wanted the Negroes arrested before Warren was given the papers. Warren himself testified that he signed the warrants in the presence of the sheriff. Rufus Head testified that he saw Clark and Hewston talking to the owner of the drive-in.

been given to Deputy Hewston to carry with him. Earlier in the day the warrants had been partially filled out. The name of the offense (Trespass after Warning) and the elements of the offense had been typed in. (Pl. Ex. 4 and 5. Hewston testified that the warrants had been partially completed earlier in the day. Clark testified that the charges had been typed in ahead of time.)

After the warrants were signed, the Sheriff approached the group of Negroes seated at the table and said, "All right, let's go." Each of the Negroes was jabbed with a cattle prod; then they were escorted into a car by the Sheriff. Carol Lawson did not hear the word "arrest" until they were toward the door.

(Testimony of Lawson) Norman was jolted on the left arm by Sheriff Clark on the way to the car. Norman was jolted as he got into one car, he was jolted again to get him out of the car, and he was jolted as he got into another car. At one point Norman attempted to avoid being jolted, and Clark asked, "Are you trying to kick me?" (Testimony of Norman)

3:25-3:30 The four Negroes were driven to the county jail and booked. (Pl. Ex. 29C)^{3/} While Wiley

3/ The Booking Sheets for the four Negroes indicate that they were arrested between 3:05 p.m. and 3:15 p.m. In view of the fact that the county cars were not dispatched to the Thirsty Boy until 3:16 and 3:17 p.m., it is likely that the times of arrest were estimated roughly after the prisoners were brought to the jail.

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and Norman were being fingerprinted, Clark asked each of them twice whether he was the one who had tried to kick Clark.

3:00-3:30 p.m. Across the street from the Wilby Theater, a small teen-age Negro and a large white man swung at each other. A large Negro man went over from the Wilby. Roger Butler, the manager of the theater, telephoned the police. A police car arrived within a few minutes, but the situation had ironed itself out in the meantime. (Testimony of Butler)

4:00-5:30 p.m. Negroes began buying tickets for the white section of the Wilby Theater. Approximately 15-20 Negroes bought tickets, entered through the white entrance, and selected seats in the white section.^{4/} When the Negroes entered the white section, four to six white

^{4/} Butler testified that no Negro tried to buy a ticket for the white section until about 5:30. Mrs. Oliver, the cashier, says she sold the first ticket to Negroes for the white section about 4:00. Milton Hopkins testified that he arrived at the theater about 2:30 p.m. or 3 p.m. and took a seat in the white section. However, Hopkins probably arrived closer to 5:00 or 5:15 p.m. since he testified that he watched the movie for about 45 minutes before Mr. Butler warned the Negroes in the theater about the crowd of whites outside. Mr. Butler's warning, as appears infra, was not given until after 6:00 p.m. It is possible that Mrs. Oliver sold Negroes tickets for the white section around 4:00 p.m. but that Butler did not notice the Negroes buy their tickets and thought that the group of Negroes buying tickets about 5:30 p.m. was the first group to buy tickets. In any event, some Negroes must have purchased tickets for the white section prior to 5:30, since Mrs. Oliver remembers selling tickets for the white section to Negroes that day and both she and Mrs. Moore testified that Mrs. Moore relieved Mrs. Oliver as cashier at 5:30.

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persons left the theater, cursing. (Testimony of Hopkins)

5:00-6:00 p.m. After Negroes began entering the white section of the Wilby Theater, a small crowd of white persons formed directly across Selma Avenue from the entrance to the theater and a large crowd of white persons formed on the southeast corner of Selma Avenue and Broad Street, in front of Carter's Drug Store. (Testimony of Butler and Head)

5:15 p.m. City Police Car No. 99 was advised that a gang had congregated on the sidewalk near the Walton Theater.

5:32-6:30 p.m. City Police cars 100 and 44 were ordered to stay uptown, close to the Wilby and Walton Theaters (Pl. Ex. 13C). The Police cars patrolled slowly past the Wilby Theater. (Testimony of Fuller, Hopkins, and Ben Jackson)

5:45-6:15 p.m. Earnest Harrell walked up to the Wilby Theater and saw a large group of Negroes outside. He asked some of his friends what was going on, and he was told that some Negroes had gone into the white section of the Wilby Theater. Harrell and Joe Smitherman went up to the ticket window for the white section and bought tickets. Smitherman entered the theater through the white entrance. Harrell started to follow

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Smitherman into the theater when he was met by a white man who asked, "Where are you going?" Harrell answered, "I bought a ticket for this door." The white man cursed. The Negro crowd began yelling. Harrell moved toward the white entrance and was again blocked by the white man. Harrell stepped back. Meanwhile, William Standberry had bought a ticket. Standberry asked the white man if he represented the management. The white man answered, "No." Standberry said, "Then you have no right to block." Then some other white men joined the man who was blocking the entrance. One of them had a knife. A Negro in the crowd said that he had a knife, and he pulled it out. He was restrained by some Negroes in the crowd. Harrell went to the ticket window and got his money back. At that point Harrell noticed that three or four uniformed officers were present. (Testimony of Harrell)

Then two more groups of Negroes arrived at the Wilby. One party consisted of Ronald Fuller, Nathaniel Harris, Philip Hunter, James Brown, Godfrey Jones, Bernard Collins, and Bernard Sims. (Testimony of Fuller) In the other group were Ben Jackson, Leon Sanders, and Hazel Chapman. (Testimony of Ben Jackson) The boys in the two groups

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stood in front of the theater and talked for about five minutes, then started to buy tickets for the white section. Fuller bought a ticket and started for the white entrance. One of the white men standing between the ticket window and the door said, "Nigger, don't go in there." Fuller's party hesitated. Fuller continued toward the entrance, and one of the white men struck Fuller on the jaw. Fuller stepped back. A Negro said, "Who do you think you are?" Fuller's assailant replied, "I'll show you who I am," and he pulled out a small knife. Fuller went to the ticket window and had his money refunded. (Testimony of Fuller)

At some point either shortly before or shortly after Fuller was struck, Sheriff Clark drove up and stopped his car in the middle of Selma Avenue, facing east. (Ben Jackson testified that Sheriff Clark had arrived and was in position to see Fuller being struck; Clark testified that he saw no one get hit and saw no weapons.) Alvery Williams, a Negro SNCC worker who may have been urging Negroes to enter the white section of the theater,^{5/} went out toward the sheriff's car and said to Clark, "Did you see that? We're paying taxes like everyone else."

(Testimony of Fuller and Ben Jackson)

^{5/} Sheriff Clark testified that he watched Williams move among the groups of Negroes in front of the theater, motioning people to come toward him. Williams testified that he did not ask people to enter the theater.

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Williams said he wanted the white men who were blocking the entrance arrested. (Testimony of Clark), Clark asked Williams, "Do you want to swear out a warrant?" and Williams replied, "I don't have to." Then Clark said, "The federal government passed the law, let them enforce it." (Testimony of Ben Jackson). Then a Negro in the crowd shouted, "Let's get 'em." (Testimony of Hill and Clark) Clark jumped out of his car and swung his night stick at a Negro, saying, "Get the hell out of here, you don't belong here anyway." (Testimony of Fuller) Clark radioed for help before he got out of the car. (Testimony of Clark) However, the Sheriff's radio log contains no entries between 3:17 and 9:03 p.m. (Fl. Ex. 29G). Officers came from all directions and began swinging their nightsticks. (Testimony of Hill) City police officers arrived. They restrained a crowd of twelve to fifteen whites, then helped Sheriff Clark disperse the Negroes. (Testimony of Cecil Goodwin and Foster) The Sheriff's officers swung their nightsticks at the Negroes and threw their nightsticks at the Negroes, causing them to scatter in all directions, mostly eastward on Selma Avenue. (Testimony of Ben Jackson,

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Fuller, Hill, and Clark).

6:00 p.m.

At some point during the confrontation between the Negro ticket-holders and the white men obstructing the entrance to the white section of the Wilby Theater, Roger Butler, manager of the theater, saw a Negro in the crowd brandishing a bottle. Butler instructed his cashier to duck, and he telephoned the police. (Testimony of Butler) City Police officers were dispatched to the Wilby.^{6/} By 6:02 car 22 had arrived at the Wilby and car 11 was on its way to the Wilby. (Pl.Ex. 13C)

6:00-6:30 p.m. After the Negroes had been dispersed from in front of the Wilby Theater, Sheriff Clark talked with Butler, then left. Shortly thereafter a crowd of whites formed in front of the theater, and someone hollered that there were "niggers" in the theater. (Testimony of Butler) Butler talked with the white crowd and asked them to allow him to talk with the Negroes inside. Butler explained to the Negroes in the white section that a hostile white crowd was outside. The Negroes got up and began to leave. (Testimony

^{6/} The City records indicate that Butler's call was received at 6:01 (Pl. Ex. 13A) and that cars 44 and 100 were advised of a complaint by Butler at 6:00 (Pl. Ex. 13C). Most probably the communication to the cars actually followed the receipt of Butler's call.

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of Butler and Hopkins) Some white men came into the viewing area. They cursed (Testimony of Hopkins) and shouted, "Get out of here; you don't belong." (Testimony of Butler) Some Sheriff's officers in khaki uniform came into the viewing area, but they did nothing. (Testimony of Hopkins)

After the Negroes had left the white section, Sheriff Clark returned. Butler asked Clark to station some men in the theater, but Clark declined. Clark and Butler then agreed that the box office should be closed, and it was closed. (Testimony of Clark and Butler)

6:12 p.m.

At 6:12 p.m. James Kendrick complained to the Selma Police about a disorderly Negro. Car 100 was dispatched. (Pl. Ex. 13A) Alvery Williams was arrested for disorderly conduct at Sylvan Street and Jeff Davis Avenue on the complaint of James Kendrick. Williams was accused of using profanity in the street in the presence of ladies. (Pl. Ex. 13E)

6:30 p.m.

The State Trooper station instructed car 66A, "Have B. McCloud Px me at my." (Pl. Ex. 31C)

6:50 p.m.

Car D1 (Sheriff Clark) requested, "Have 274 contact B. McCloud." (Pl. Ex. 31C)

7:49 p.m.

State Trooper Car 274 reported, "B. McCloud has been contacted by S.O. X 10-3." (Pl. Ex. 31C)

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9:50 p.m.

A bottle was thrown through the right rear window of George Corson's automobile as he drove past Clay's Casino on Broad Street. Corson's daughter was cut about the mouth and neck; Corson's neighbor, James Jones, was cut on the arm; and George Corson, Jr., was cut on the neck and arm. (Pl. Ex. 13D; Def. Ex. 9A, 9B, 9C, 9D, 9E; Testimony of Nicholson) The incident occurred in a Negro neighborhood (Testimony of Cecil Goodwin), and a large crowd of Negroes was crossing the street at the time the bottle was thrown. (Testimony of George W. Corson). The bottle was probably thrown by a Negro Male.^{7/}

9:57 p.m.

At 9:57 p.m. the city Police Department received a complaint concerning the incident near Clay's Casino and four officers were dispatched. (Pl. Ex. 13A and 13C)

10:00-10:30p.m. Odell Solomon was standing in front of Clay's

Casino on Broad Street waiting for a cab.

A city policeman asked him what he was doing and told him to stand back against the wall

7/ Pl. Ex. 13D, The statement of Walter Ferguson indicates that Philip Hunter threw the bottle. City Police Officer Steinwinder, who was dispatched to the scene (Pl. Ex. 13A), testified that he was given the description of a Negro male. On July 7, 1964, Philip Hunter, a Negro, was charged with throwing a missile at a car in connection with the July 4 incident near Clay's Casino. Pl. Ex. 48, Booking Sheet No. 18967.

and not to block the sidewalk. Then the police drove off, and about that time the sheriff's car drove up to Clay's Casino and some special deputies got out of the car. One of the possemen told Solomon to get inside or go home. Solomon stepped inside the doorway and said he was waiting for a cab, then stepped out. He had called a cab. One of the officers hit Solomon on the left side of the forehead.^{8/} Solomon went to Dr. Walker. Dr. Walker placed three sutures in a wound over Solomon's left eye and applied a dressing. Solomon was bleeding and somewhat shocked. (Testimony of Dr. Walker).

10:11 p.m. City car 100 reported, "Duke & Small - yellow & white Chev. 27-9776 white boys throwing things from car and shooting fire-crackers." (Pl. Ex. 13C)

10:23 p.m. County car D-5 was advised, "Cross Burning 80 & 14."

^{8/} Pl. Ex. 13D indicates that the incident occurred at 11:55 p. m. However, Solomon's testimony suggests that the time was earlier, near the time when Corson's car was struck. Dr. Walker testified that he treated Solomon around 9:00 or 10:00 p.m.

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10:46 p.m. City Police car 44 was advised, "Parking Lot Baptist Hosp. - Mrs. Driskell 2 C M in old Blk car making passes at all nurses." (Pl. Ex. 13C)

10:51 p.m. City Police car 44 reported, "We got 3 out of this car." (Pl. Ex. 13C)

10:55 p.m. City Police car 44 reported, "we have 3 on way to H Q." (Pl. Ex. 13C)

11:03 p.m. Willie James Peat, Charlie L. Peat, and John Wesley Motley, all Negroes, were received at the Selma City jail. They were all charged with disorderly conduct for whistling at nurses as the nurses entered the Baptist Hospital. The charge was changed to, "Trespass after warning." All three were found guilty, fined ten dollars, and released on July 7. (Pl. Ex. 27B; Pl. Ex. 27A, warrants No. 110424, 110425, and 110426)

11:52 p.m. State Trooper car 294 reported, "Advise Capt. Cross Burning at 5 & 80."

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9:16 a.m. State Investigator Head stopped at the county jail. (Pl. Ex. 31C, see Table I)

9:54 a.m. State Investigator Head reported, "Everything quiet." (Pl. Ex. 31C)

10:00 a.m. Solicitor Blanchard McLeod arrived in Selma. (Testimony of McLeod)

11:10 a.m. County Car D2 asked State Trooper Car 48 for full registration information on a 1964 Georgia license plate number. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

11-11:30 a.m. Jerry DeMuth and David Prince arrived in Selma from Atlanta, Georgia, on assignment to cover voter registration activities for the Black Star News Agency. They checked in at the Albert Hotel, then advised Special Agent Robert Frye of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that they were in town. (Testimony of DeMuth and Prince, (Pl. Ex. 30B, Report of Sgt. Herman Pitts, July 15, 1964)

11:15 a.m. State Trooper Unit 200 (Col. Lingo) asked over the radio where D1 (Clark) was located. He was told the Sheriff was at the County Jail. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

11:23 a.m. State Trooper Unit 572 (Head) stopped at the county jail. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

11:30 a.m. Prince and DeMuth went to Sheriff Clark's office about 11:30 a.m. They talked with Deputy Crocker in his office. Solicitor McLeod also was present. Special Agent Frye was also present for part of the interview.

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A number of possemen, wearing khaki uniforms and helmets, saw Prince and DeMuth at the Sheriff's office. (Textimony of Prince)

Prince and DeMuth were asked to supply the answers to form questionnaires covering their personal backgrounds. (Pl. Ex. 11 and 12; testimony of Crocker) DeMuth and Prince told Crocker and McLeod that they were on assignment from Black Star Agency to cover civil rights activities in Selma. Crocker told them that press credentials were no good in Selma because he could keep them out of any place. McLeod said, "I don't like the northern press, mind your own business."

(Testimony of Prince) McLeod asked DeMuth, "Why does trouble come after you do?" (Testimony of DeMuth)

12:58 p.m. State Trooper Unit 572 (Head) was at Carter's Drug Store with Solicitor McLeod. (Pl. Ex. 31C, Testimony of McLeod)

1:33 p.m. State Trooper Unit 572 (Head) stopped at the Sheriff's Office. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

1:51 p. m. County car D1 (Clark) and State Trooper Car 200 (Col. Lingo) were en route to the scene of an accident. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

4:34-4:58 p.m. Between 4:34 and 4:55 p.m., Selma police patrol cars observed Benny Tucker as he brought carloads of persons to the Walton theater in a station wagon. (Pl. Ex. 13C; Testimony of Chambers)^{1/} Tucker had driven the station wagon

^{1/} The City Police radio log contains the following entries:
4:34 p.m. (to car 11 from the station) "West from Franklin 6 to 8 walking." 4:36 p.m. (to the station from car 11) "We
(cont'd on next p.)

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from Memphis, Tennessee, to Selma that day.

The car had a Georgia license plate on the rear and a 1963 California tag on the front.

4:55 p.m.

At 4:55 the police station ordered car No. 22 to bring in one of the pamphlets that Tucker had in the car with him. One of the pamphlets was obtained by the police. It advertised a meeting, giving the place, time, and speaker. (Pl. Ex. 13C; Testimony of Chambers) As the car was being pushed on Franklin Street with Tucker behind the steering wheel, Sheriff Clark drove up and told Tucker to pull over.

Clark asked for Tucker's driver's license, and Tucker showed him his Alabama license.

Clark checked the tags, then told Tucker he

4:58 p.m.

was under arrest for improper tags. At 4:58 Tucker was arrested and booked for "Improper License Plates." No one asked him why he had a 1964 Georgia tag on the back and a 1963 California tag on the front of the car. (Pl. Ex. 47, Booking Sheet No. 18904; Testimony of Tucker)

5:03 p.m.

At 5:03 p.m. Dallas County Car D4 requested from the State Troopers the full registration information on a 1964 Georgia license tag number. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

5:08 p.m.

State Trooper Unit 572 (Head) stopped at the Sheriff's office. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

6:45-7:15 p.m. About 6:45 p.m. David Prince and Jerry DeMuth

left the Albert Hotel and went to the Selma Del

1/(cont'd) see them." 4:40 p.m. (to the station from car 11)
"At Walton now." 4:41 p.m. (to the station from car 33) "Benn:
is at Dallas & Broad." 4:44 p.m. (to the station from car 100)
"On way back now." (cont'd on next p.)

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Restaurant for their evening meal. While they were in the restaurant, a cook beckoned to a white man and pointed to Prince and DeMuth. The white man was well-built, weighed about 220 pounds, and was in his early forties. He sat on a stool and stared at the two newsmen for about two minutes. Prince and DeMuth left the restaurant at about 7:15 p.m. (Testimony of DeMuth and Prince; Pl. Ex. 20B, Report of Sgt. Herman Pitts, July 15, 1964)

7:00 p.m. Sheriff's officers reported for duty at the Sheriff's office to cover the Negro mass meeting at the A.M.E. Hall. (Def. Ex. 12, Affidavit of Crocker)

7:00-7:15 p.m. A group of deputies and possemen arrived at the A.M.E. Hall. Deputies Blair and Doorwright arrived with Posseman Atchison. (Testimony of Atchison) Deputy Averett arrived in a car with Deputy Crocker. (Testimony of Averette. Crocker must have returned to the Sheriff's office, because he brought a group of possemen from the office to the Hall about 9:00 p.m., as will appear, infra.) Posseman Suther also arrived about 7:00 p.m. with a deputy. (Testimony of Suther)

7:05 p.m. State Trooper Unit 572 (Head) asked over the radio for the whereabouts of Col. Lingo and Sheriff Clark. He was told they were at the Shell Station on Broad Street. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

1/ (cont'd) 4:49 p.m. (to the station from car 22) "At City Bldg. in Sta Wagon."

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7:30-10:00 p.m. Police Chief Mullen arrived at the A.M.E.

Hall with Lt. Pyron in the car at about 7:30. They parked 500-600 feet south of the entrance to the hall. They did not leave the car that evening. (Testimony of Mullen) Lt. R. E. Etheridge of the Alabama State Troopers was riding with Captain Moore in Car 345. A man in a car with Mississippi plates told the officers that he had just left the Selma Del Restaurant where a waitress had said that a blond-headed man with a camera had a pistol in the restaurant.

7:52 p.m. (Testimony of R. E. Etheridge) At 7:52 p.m. State Car No. 345 requested that the city be called with reference to two white reporters in the Selma Del, one a "cottonhead" with a camera and with a gun in his pocket. (Pl. Ex.

7:59 p.m. 31C) At 7:59 p.m. the City Police received a complaint from Captain Moore of the State Patrol that a reporter had a pistol at the Selma Del Restaurant. All City patrol cars were assigned to the complaint, and the officers assigned reported that the reporter was at the church at 710 Green Street. (Pl. Ex. 13A). The dispatcher on watch at the City Police Station indicated that he knew the reporter and the photographer with white hair. (Pl. Ex. 13C)

7:40-9:30 p.m. The meeting at the A.M.E. Hall began about 7:40. About six speakers addressed the

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meeting. (Testimony of Prince and DeMuth. There were between 150 and 300 Negroes at the meeting. The crowd was equally divided between adults and young people.^{2/} Besides Prince and DeMuth, there were five whites in the meeting. (Testimony of DeMuth; Pl. Ex. 306, Report of Sgt. Herman Pitts, July 15, 1964) Two of these whites were State Investigator Head and Deputy Sheriff Stoves. (Testimony of Head and Stoves)' The speakers discussed voter registration and the use of public accommodations by Negroes. (Testimony of Goodwin and DeMuth) Willie C. Robertson was one of the speakers. In the course of his speech he said, "You don't have to rape any white woman." John Love urged the adults to register to vote and urged the minors to support the adults. (Testimony of Love and Head) One speaker encouraged Negroes to test public accommodations, but told them to turn away if service was refused. (Testimony of Florene Goodwin) The meeting was lively, with singing and hand-clapping, but it was not disorderly. (Testimony of DeMuth. David Prince noticed three or four persons looking into the meeting through the windows of the hall. They were not in uniform but

2/ Testimony of David Prince, Jerry DeMuth, Rufus Head, Clinton Presley, and John Beverly. DeMuth estimated that 150-160 persons attended the meeting. Presley estimated 150-200. Head estimated 250-300.

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they were armed with nightsticks. They looked through the window for about 15 or 20 minutes. Prince learned that a group of men was forming outside the hall, and Prince passed the news on to John Love. Love looked outside and told Prince that it "did not look good." Prince later learned that an empty school bus was outside, and he passed this information on to Love. Love said that it looked as if the officers were planning a mass arrest. The meeting was extended for an extra half-hour in order to wait for the arrival of John Lewis, who was scheduled to speak. Lewis did not arrive, and the meeting was adjourned about 9:30. (Pl. Ex. 30B, Report of Sgt. Herman Pitts, July 15, 1964) At the end of the meeting, John Love asked the people to go home quietly in order to avoid trouble. (Testimony of Love) The meeting closed after the singing of "We Shall Overcome." (Pl. Ex. 30B, supra)

9:00-9:30 p.m. At approximately 9:00 p.m. Deputy Crocker took about 40 members of the Sheriff's posse to the A.M.E. Hall. About ten deputies were already at the hall in cars. (Def. Ex. 12, Affidavit of Crocker) Crocker instructed the officers to line up opposite the meeting hall and not to move until instructed to do so. (Testimony of Wallis)

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The officers lined up side by side from north to south across the street from the hall. (Testimony of Leashore) One Negro said that he could get his gun and handle "all them sons of bitches," meaning the officers. (Testimony of Beverly and Atchison) There were from 50 to 65 deputies and posse men outside the hall.^{3/} Before the people began to leave the meeting, Crocker gave two tear gas bombs to Deputy Averett, telling him that when Crocker threw his bomb Averett should throw his. (Testimony of Averett)

9:30 p.m.

About 9:30 the meeting in the A.M.E. Hall adjourned. David Prince and Jerry DeMuth came out of the Hall ahead of the Negroes. Prince tried to take photographs of the officers lined up across the street from the Hall, but each time he attempted to focus on the officers they turned their flashlight beams into the lenses of his camera. (Testimony of Prince and DeMuth) Negroes started coming out of the meeting and dispersing. They may have been chanting or singing, but, according to one posseman, they were "peaceful as you want 'em." (Testimony of Presley)

^{3/} In his affidavit, (Def. Ex. 12) Deputy Crocker estimates that 10 deputies and 40 possemen were there. Jerry DeMuth estimated that 63 to 65 officers were outside the Hall when the meeting adjourned.

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David Prince decided he would photograph the Negroes coming out from the church.

After photographing some of the Negroes leaving the Hall, Prince and DeMuth went back inside the Hall to remove their equipment. (Testimony of Prince and DeMuth)

After a substantial number of Negroes had left the Hall, an object, or perhaps two objects, struck a county car with a loud noise. Deputy Crocker ordered the possemen to advance upon the Negro crowd, and Crocker and Deputy Averett released tear gas bombs.

9:31 p.m.

The possemen who had been lined up across the street from the Hall advanced into the crowd of Negroes swinging their nightsticks. ^{4/}

^{4/} There is a conflict in testimony as to how many missiles struck cars before Crocker gave the order to disperse the Negroes. Johnny Leashore, Cordelia Lamar and Eugene Rutledge testified that they heard one object strike a car, and then the possemen ran toward the crowd of Negroes. Deputy Crocker testified that almost immediately after Negroes began coming out of the church, bricks and other missiles began flying. Crocker said that he waited a minute or more before giving the order to disperse the crowd. He said that in the meantime he had heard a barrage of rocks. Several other deputies and possemen testified that a number of rocks were thrown before the order was given to advance on the Negroes. The defendants produced two rocks that had been thrown from the crowd. Investigator Head identified Def. Ex. 7 as a rock that struck his car and that he or Deputy Stoves recovered. He identified Def. Ex. 8 as a rock that struck Crocker's car. Crocker testified that Def. Ex. 7 and Def. Ex. 8 were rocks that he picked up during a patrol of the area which began after the crowd had been dispersed. Deputy Stoves testified that before Crocker had given the order to disperse, Stoves had twice gotten out of the car in which he and Head were parked to pick up rocks that had struck the car, and identified Def. Ex. 7 and 8 as two rocks recovered at that time, one by Stoves himself and one by Head in the presence of Stoves. Deputy Averett testified that an object hit the bus, then another hit a white Corvair, then one hit the door of a county car; then, after a barrage of rocks were thrown, Crocker threw his

(cont'd on next p.)

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After Prince and DeMuth had removed their equipment from the Hall, they saw possemen swinging clubs. (Testimony of Prince and DeMuth) One of the newsmen said to Johnny Leashore, who was standing next to him, "Let's run; I don't know where to go." Leashore suggested going into a nearby house, that belonged to Mrs. Cordelia Lamar. Leashore jumped onto the porch and made it inside. The newsman tried to run to the steps of the porch but did not make it inside. Five or

4/ (cont'd) tear gas. In an affidavit, Posseman John Cross said he was struck on the leg by a piece of stone thrown by a Negro. (Def. Ex. 12) Photographs taken on the morning of July 6 of the area around the A.M.E. Hall (Testimony of Stoves) show no debris. (Pl. Ex. 5A through 5F). The photographs of vehicles which were identified as those struck by thrown objects (Def. Ex. 6C through 6G) show only minor damage. It is possible that some objects were thrown after the order had been given to the officers to disperse the Negro crowd.

There is also a dispute as to whether the gunshot which many witnesses heard was fired before or after the order to disperse the crowd. Deputy Crocker testified that he heard a muffled shot before he gave the order to disperse. Several other deputies and possemen testified to the same effect. Both David Prince and Jerry DeMuth testified that they heard the shot after they had both been struck and had made their way to the back of the meeting hall, which was some time after the possemen had dispersed the Negroes. Rufus Head testified that when Crocker ordered the tear gas released, he got his gas mask out of the trunk, and then called the highway patrol station to contact Col. Lingo and Sheriff Clark. The State radio log reveals that Head's call was placed at 9:31 p.m. (Pl. Ex. 31C).

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six possemen gathered around the newsman, who was lying on the ground bleeding. Some possemen came onto the porch of Mrs. Lamar's house. They pushed at the door, then threw a chair against the window screen. One of the possemen said, "Get your ass on the floor." Some men in yellow clothes broke out two windows in the back of Mrs. Lamar's house. (Testimony of Johnny Leashore and Lamar)

David Prince's camera was grabbed and smashed against a wall. Prince was struck on the back and pushed to the ground. DeMuth was struck from behind. He felt a sudden pain at the top of his head, then fell to his knees.^{5/} Prince was hit a couple more times by uniformed officers. DeMuth got up in a daze. Prince turned and saw DeMuth standing in front of the building with his hands on his face, bleeding. Prince got DeMuth and dragged him toward the rear of the building. Then the two men became physically separated, and when Prince turned to look for DeMuth, a flashlight beam hit him in the eyes. In back of the Hall a group of possemen rushed toward Prince and DeMuth.

^{5/} It is impossible to determine from the testimony which of the two newsmen tried to follow Leashore into Mrs. Lamar's house or at what point in time Leashore saw one of the newsmen lying on the ground surrounded by possemen.

They both heard a shot, then someone said, "Don't move or you're dead." Prince saw the man who had stared at him in the Selma Del Restaurant. The man said, "Let me have him, I know him." The man charged at Prince with a stick. Prince fell on the ground, covered his head, and rolled. The man struck Prince several times, but he was able to keep moving. Prince tried to get under the building, but tear gas was thrown under the building. Several Negroes were dragged out from under the building. Prince was exposed to a lot of tear gas, and so was the man who was hitting him. (Testimony of Prince and DeMuth)

Prince and DeMuth were both dragged to the front of the Hall. On the way to the front of the Hall, DeMuth was hit on the side of the head and his glasses were knocked off. In front of the building DeMuth was forced to the ground. Prince was told to sit down. When he began to sit down, one of the officers said, "No, not here," and kicked him. When he began to sit down again, one of the officers said, "No, not there," and kicked him. Prince lay down and was searched. The man that Prince had seen at the Selma Del said, "He has a gun." (Testimony of Prince and DeMuth)

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The officers took DeMuth's car keys from him, and then DeMuth's car was searched while Prince and DeMuth were forced to stand with their hands up on a patrol car. The search was ordered by a man identified by the deputies as Sheriff Clark. The floodlights which DeMuth had been carrying were smashed. A deputy took Prince's camera and hit the lens with his nightstick. The sheriff got the camera and said, "You can't do that," then handed the camera back to Prince. One officer said, "I ought to kill you," and another said, "I ought to fill you full of lead." (Testimony of Prince and DeMuth)

Solicitor McLeod came up and said, "DeMuth, you promised me you wouldn't start anything. Prince, if you have that gun, you'd better give it to me." (Testimony of McLeod)

McLeod screamed at Prince and DeMuth, "Go back to your hotel, get your things, and get out of town, or you'll be killed if followed". (Testimony of Prince)

DeMuth asked McLeod for protection. McLeod said that the lawman hadn't hurt DeMuth and that McLeod couldn't have DeMuth followed all around town. DeMuth said he wanted protection to get out of town, and McLeod said, "You can certainly get that." (Testimony of McLeod)

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9:31 p.m. State Trooper Car 572 (Head) radioed the station, "Have 200 (Lingo) and D1 (Clark) get down". (Pl. Ex. 31C)

9:32 p.m. State Trooper Car 229 reported that Lingo could be reached at 4-9360. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

9:34 p.m. State Trooper Car 200 (Lingo) advised that he was in route to 710 Green Street. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

9:43 p.m. At 9:43 Selma Police Car No. 11, in which Sgt. Cecil Goodwin and Officer F. J. Ellison were patrolling, reported that a Negro had hit the car with a coke bottle. (Pl. Ex. 13C; Testimony of Goodwin) This occurred as the car was traveling north on Lawrence Street a block east and a little south of the A.M.E. Hall. The officers got out of the car and picked up the bottle. They got back into the car, turned around, and drove south on Lawrence to Selma Avenue. They turned around again and headed north on Lawrence. When they passed the place where the bottle had been thrown, another bottle was thrown against the car.^{6/} This time the officers saw two

^{6/} Dep. Ex. 12. Affidavits of Cecil Goodwin and F. J. Ellison. Both men testified that they turned the car around once before being struck the second time. But both men said in their affidavits that they turned around twice. Their recollection was probably more accurate at the time they made the affidavits.

Negro males running east between the houses. Each officer chased one of the Negroes. Goodwin fired one shot into the air. The Negroes were not apprehended. The officers took both bottles to headquarters to be tested for fingerprints. (Def. Ex. 12, Affidavits of Cecil Goodwin and F. J. Ellison; Testimony of Cecil Goodwin and Ellison)

9:48 p.m. City Police Car 11 radioed cars 22 and 44 to check for a Negro throwing a bottle. (Pl. Ex. 13C)

9:49 p.m. State Trooper Car 345 instructed cars 297 and 322 to have local cars report to Green Street. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

9:51 p.m. State Trooper car 345 instructed car 245 to head on in to Selma. (Pl. Ex. 31C)

9:57 p.m. The Selma Police Station advised Car No. 1 that a curfew had been ordered in the area of 710 Green Street, by authority of Sheriff Clark. (Pl. Ex. 13C)

10:00 p.m. City Police Car 11 reported "clr on bottle thrower". (Pl. Ex. 13C)

10:00 p.m. Ned Johnson, who is mentally deficient and in the care of a guardian, had attended the meeting in the A.M.E. Hall and was right in front of the hall. A man in

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khaki pants and a khaki shirt, with something like a bucket on his head, hit Johnson. He was hit twice and knocked unconscious.(Pl. Ex. 13D; Testimony of Johnson.)

John Hardy was visiting a friend at 604 Lawrence Street when he heard a commotion on Green Street. He heard a posseman knock at the house across the street and say, "Put the lights out and go to bed. "Hardy went toward the sidewalk. As he was walking along a posseman said, "Didn't I tell you to go home?". Hardy answered, "That's where I'm going." The posseman said, "No you aren't, you're going to the ground." Then the posseman clubbed Hardy to the ground. Hardy began bleeding, and he started for his wife's house in George Washington Carver Homes. (Testimony of John Hardy)

Carrie Hardy, John Hardy's estranged wife, was sitting on the front porch at 131-C George Washington Carver Homes when some men in brown pants with helmets and clubs came up and said, "Get inside and turn off the lights, that's the Sheriff's orders." Mrs. Hardy went inside, and the men broke her porch light with a stick. (Testimony of Carrie Hardy)

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10:25 p.m. John Hardy arrived at his wife's house covered with blood. He was bleeding from the neck and the top of the head. Mrs. Hardy telephoned a Mr. Anderson. (Testimony of Carrie Hardy) At 10:25 Mr. Anderson reported Hardy's injury to the Selma Police. (Pl. Ex. 13A)

10:30 p.m. At about 10:30 p.m. John Hardy arrived by ambulance at Burwell Infirmary. Wounds on his head and back were dressed, but no stitches were required. His skull was x-rayed and he was given a tetanus shot. His doctor was E. L. Maddox. (Testimony of Minnie B. Anderson)

David Prince and Jerry DeMuth drove back to their hotel and checked out. As they left the hotel a dark station wagon followed them. It stayed behind them for 10 or 15 minutes as they drove toward Montgomery. There were no uniformed men in the station wagon. (Testimony of Prince and DeMuth)

Members of the posse knocked on doors in the neighborhood of Mrs. Vashti Leashore, who lived at 712 Lawrence Street. The possemen were saying, "Cut out your god-damn lights and turn off the television." Mrs. Leashore's ward, Ned Johnson, arrived

in a taxi. When Mrs. Leashore saw that Johnson was bleeding, she turned on her porch light. A posseman told Mrs. Leashore to turn off the light, but when she pointed out Johnson's condition, the posseman asked to use her phone. She heard the posseman say on the phone, "We done got one of them, what do we do?" Sometime later, a sheriff's man, possibly Deputy Bates, arrived. Johnson said to Mrs. Leashore, "Cuz, don't let 'em take me; they'll finish killing me." Mrs. Leashore told the lawmen she would take care of Johnson. (Testimony of Vashtie Leashore) At

11:10 p.m.

11:10 p.m. Mrs. Leashore reported the incident to the Selma Police Department. (Pl. Ex. 13D)

Mr. Gildersleeve, at George Washington Carver Homes, complained to the Selma Police, "breaking windows - throwing bottles - need protection."

11:16 p.m.

At 11:16 car 22 reported, "Don't see anything," (Pl. Ex. 13A and 13C)

11:24 p.m.

City Police car 33 was instructed, "Green St. Go see if ambulance is needed." (Pl. Ex. 13C)

11:29 p.m.

City police car 33 reported, "Don't see anyone needing ambulance." (Pl. Ex. 13C)

11:30 p.m.

At about 11:30 p.m. Dr. Isabel Dumont was called to treat Johnson. Johnson

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was conscious, but had lacerations on the left side of his head and an abrasion on his head. He required 6 stitches.
(Testimony of Dumont)

11:30 p.m.

At 11:30 p.m. Prince and DeMuth were treated at St. Margaret's Hospital in Montgomery by Doctor William M. Sanders. (Pl. Ex. 8 and 9) DeMuth was treated first. He was bleeding from a two-inch cut, which was closed with seven stitches. He had a painfully swollen elbow, but it was not broken. He had scattered bruises on his legs and was covered with blood. He seemed adled. Prince appeared outwardly to be in better general condition. There were bruises on his back that looked as if they had been made by a stick. He had two bruises on his shoulder blades and two in the middle of his back, one on his right chest wall. They were visible bruises, which were red but later turned black and blue. Dr. Sanders did not feel it was necessary for either man to remain in the hospital. (Testimony of Sanders)

July 6

7:45 a.m. Gertrude Young came to the Dallas County Courthouse to register to vote. (Testimony of Mrs. Young) She received priority number 7 from a deputy sheriff, (Pl.Ex. 29F)

8:18 a.m. City Police Car No. 44 reported: "no one by courthouse--a few by Federal Building." (Pl.Ex. 13C)

8:51 a.m. City Police Car No. 99 reported "about 6 in SNCC HQ" (Pl.Ex. 13C)

9:00 a.m. Mildred Parker came to the courthouse to register to vote. She told the posseman at the Lauderdale Street entrance that she wanted to register and he told her to "go around to the back." She went to the alley on Lauderdale Street, and there a posseman told her to go to the Alabama Avenue side. She received number 34 and did not get in to register that day. (Testimony of Mrs. Parker and Pl.Ex. 29F) Throughout the day 48 Negroes and one white person signed up to register to vote. 21 Negroes were allowed to fill out application forms. (Testimony of George Baker)

-- Reporters told Sheriff Clark's office that there will be picketing that day. (Testimony of Clark)

After the arrest of the pickets a Negro on the steps began to sing and the others joined in. Ex. 14 and Testimony of George Baker) and

Clark announced over a loudspeaker: "Stay where you are; you're all under arrest." Clark also stated over the loudspeaker: "They're running around the corner." (Testimony of Donald Davis) Reverend Ralph Abernathy spoke at the meeting (Pl.Ex. 22 and Testimony of Head, Clark, and Beverly) and pledged to "bury segregation". (Testimony of Head and Stoves). The church was full. (Testimony of Head) There was no violence at the meeting (Testimony of Stoves), which included singing, clapping, and a speaker (Testimony of Suther). Clark saw a person throwing missiles into the churchyard as if the objects were being stockpiled. (Testimony of Clark)
