Lee v. Macon

- 59 Systems to be included in Motion - at least 85% of Negro students remain in Negro schools
- 17 Systems maintaining dual school system but with less than 85% of Negro students in Negro schools
- 15 Had no Negro schools during the 1967-68 school year
- 7 Have said they will close their last Negro school prior to the start of the 1968-69 school year
- 1 Has said it will close its last Negro school for the 1969-70 school year [has started phasing it out]
