1. I am a Port Commissioner for the Port of Seattle. In that role, I am one of the elected officials responsible for Sea-Tac Airport.

2. The Customs and Border Protection Agency (CBP) is responsible for determining who is granted access to the United States. I have requested, repeatedly, information about who is being denied access to the United States at Sea-Tac Airport.

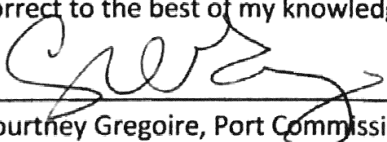
3. Because of federal law, Customs and Border Protection is limiting the information that they have given to us. However, upon reasonable belief, we have reason to believe that two people are currently being denied access into the United States by CBP. They are scheduled to be immediately removed on a flight to Dubai, scheduled to leave at 5:00 pm

4. In order for a person to board a plane headed to Sea-Tac Airport to enter the United States, they necessarily would have been required to have not only a passport, but also legal documentation authorizing their legal entry into the United States.

5. I have personally met with another family earlier today whose loved one has already been returned to their country of origin. This family shared a copy of a valid visa with me.

6. I am aware that these two persons are scheduled to be immediately flown to Dubai on a flight scheduled to depart at 5:00 pm.
